Pastor's Notes:

We recently celebrated the Lord's Baptism by His cousin, St. John the Baptist. John's baptism was only symbolic---it was a sign that someone was turning his or her life around, but it did not take away sin. Jesus, when He was baptized, of course, had no sin, since sin is separation from God and He is God (the Second Person of the Holy Trinity). Rather, when He was baptized, He made water a sacramental sign (that is, some material which can, with the proper "form" (words and intention) actually do something---take away sins and make us adopted children of God). The baptism which is done in the name of the Lord Jesus (actually in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit---see Mt. 28:19f), is the baptism in water and spirit (Holy Spirit) and blood (made effective by the Precious Blood shed on the Cross) that is spoken of in the First Letter of St. John (see ch. 5:6-8 especially). Since the death and resurrection and ascension of Jesus, baptism really does do something to us. Most of us received it as infants or children, so we did not know the full power of what happened at the time (nor do we now---I am almost 73 years old and I am still learning what it means!), but the Christian community around us teaches us what it means to die and rise with Christ---dying to our old self and rising as a new person, reborn, so to speak. That is why the faith of families, especially the families of the newly-baptized are so important, but not just our own particular family, but the family of our spiritual community, the parish and the larger Church. That is why we have sponsors (a man and a woman) or at least one sponsor, who represents the rest of the Church. Picking a sponsor for baptism should not be just an empty honor, but a chance to reinforce the gift that has been given. We could say the same about sponsors for confirmation as well. By the way, the preferred sponsor for confirmation is the baptismal sponsor, all other things being equal. Although at the present time we do not have many baptisms here, we are preparing to have the Bishop confirm twenty-some young people this fall (we do it every third year), and much of what we say about baptism also applies to confirmation, since it is closely related and is the "crowning" of baptism. In the early days of the Church, confirmation was done at the same time as baptism, and the Holy Eucharist was also administered for the first time, even to infants (a few drops of the Precious Blood), and this is still the practice of the Eastern Churches (including those in communion with the See of Rome). For those of you who will be involved in future baptisms and/or confirmations and/or first confessions and First Holy Communions, do not forget the special role you play in the lives of our dear young people. It is not so much that people will be "turned away" from any sacraments---it is really up to the family to decide if this is something important and, if so, how to ensure that it will be important to the next generation.
