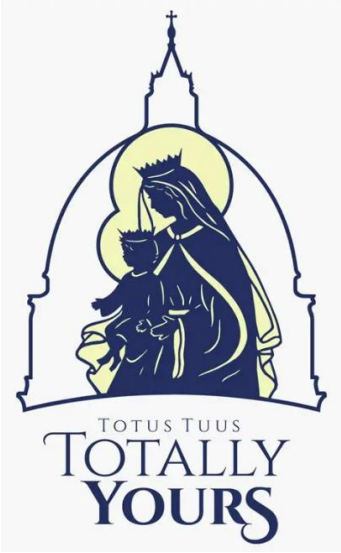

Pastor’s Notes:

Today is observed in our country as Flag Day. We thank Tom Davidson for taking care of the American flag in front of our church. Since this is the year when our nation celebrates its 250th birthday, we are proud of our flag and, even more importantly, the nation for which it stands. Some of the great and high ideals of the Founders are based in Judeo-Christian ideas and culture—the dignity of the human person, the importance of the freedom to act in a moral way, and so on. May God bless our people and our land.

Next weekend we welcome the men and women who are coming to lead our young people in the Totus Tuus week. Since the Marian Sisters have not been able lately to staff many of their old “haunts” (such as our parish), we are more than happy to welcome these college-age young people and their enthusiasm and love for the faith. Since McCook was not able to schedule a team for their own parish this year, some of the students from there have asked to join in the activities of our week. We are happy to include them here! Thanks to Miranda Teel, our religious education director, and all the people who are providing shelter and meals and other support during that week.

Tomorrow is the day that people are warned to stay off the highways—the priests’ new assignments take place and many of them are on the move. We are sad to see Fr. Kimminau leave as our neighbor, but we are overjoyed to have our own parish native son Fr. Rayer take his place at St. Patrick’s in McCook. Fr. Kimminau did a little research before he left—he said that he and I were the “bronze” medalists for being pastor in the post-OMI (Oblates of Mary Immaculate, the order replaced by diocesan priests in 1980) priest era (each of us for four years there), Msgr. Hain was the “silver” (five years), and, of course, Fr. Brethour was the “gold” (23 years as pastor, not counting his two years as my assistant there). I am the oldest living former pastor from there (my first two years there I had Fr. Lorenz as my assistant), and I do not know how I did the things I once did (like being the principal at the school as well as the pastor), but youth is capable of many things. I told Bishop Conley a few years ago that I thought I still had some gas in the tank (I hope I am not running on fumes!), but I am happy to be of service as a parish priest even though I am already eligible by age for retirement. If I continue in pretty good health, I am happy to be of help. God does not need me (or any of us, for that matter), but we each have something to give for the good of our brothers and sisters in the Church, and, as long as I am not being hit with a firehose of challenges (as in younger days in bigger places, when we like challenges), I am glad to be in Indianola now. I am looking forward to Confirmation on November 7 this year and our centennial celebration of the church, which will take place on October 17, 2026. If anyone is interested—I will probably not still be “in the saddle” by then—July 21, 2030 will be the 150th anniversary of the first Mass in this parish. Peace!
