Pastor's Notes:

Parish council, which normally meets on the last Sunday of the month, will meet next Sunday (August 24) at 6 P.M. at the rectory. The last Sunday of this month is part of Labor Day weekend. We have not had regular meetings on the last Sunday in June or July. We do have to review the budget for the coming year. The painting project is on track to be done soon.

We are happy to welcome our students and teachers back for religious education classes (CCD) on Wednesdays. We are going to have a good start about the same time that day-school starts. God bless you all!

The Ten Commandments are a good place to start when we are looking at the moral life. Given to Moses, they have not been abolished in the New Testament, although we may now see them in the "light of Christ." Traditionally, in the numbering of them, Catholics (and Lutherans) follow one way of listing them, while others follow another, although the substance is still the same—they are only "packaged" differently, much as the Psalms are—that is why some versions of the Bible number the 150 psalms in another way. For example, what some people refer to as the "Sixth Commandment" refers to the exhortation "do not kill," but we refer to it as the Fifth Commandment. In our traditional Catholic listing, the first three commandments have to do with love of God (which could be called the greatest obligation we have), while the last seven refer to love of neighbor, which, according to Jesus, is closely related to the love of God. We list the First Commandment as: "I am the Lord your God—you shall not have strange gods before Me." I do not think that we now have too many people bowing to inanimate "idols" as the ancients once did, but we do have other "idols" that we could worship—money, power, pleasure, fame being the most obvious. None of these things is necessarily evil in itself, but when we make something else the center of our lives, we can run aground of this commandment. Sins against faith, hope, and love are generally listed as sins against this commandment—although all sins, in reality, are sins against love. Sins against faith include: denial of any of the truths which God teaches through the Church, deliberate doubt about any truth of faith (which, by the way, is not the same as questioning—that can be a very good thing, if we are honestly seeking the truth), failure to profess the faith when obliged to do so, failure to obtain necessary religious instruction, reading books dangerous to our faith, refusal to accept the authority of the pope as visible head of the Church, worship of some created thing instead of the true God, superstition, attendance at spiritualistic séances or the consultation of mediums, are examples given in the *Life in Christ* catechism. Sins against hope are usually listed as presumption and despair—"too much" and "too little" of this virtue. Sins against love are treated under the other commandments. God bless you!
