Pastor's Notes:

The first commandment has to do with not making idols—things that we put in front of our duty to God. The second commandment, also dealing with our duty to God, says that we should not take God's name in vain. We show reverence for the Holy Name. Names are very important to us—we want people to call us by our preferred name (in my family, on Dad's side especially, middle names were often the preferred name, and in some communities, nicknames were preferred). A name (whether first, middle, or last) is a special possession for us. God's name is important as well. He revealed His name to Moses at the burning bush, and it is so holy that even today, devout Jews (and Christians) refrain from using it, even in prayer. In English, it is sometimes represented as YHWH. In the original Hebrew, there were no vowels used when words were written, and only later were vowel signs added to texts. The vowel signs added to God's name were those of the word for "Lord," and if you check most Scripture translations, the word LORD is used when God's name is in the text. When the Hebrew is read, the word for "Lord" is said, even though the YHWH is there in the text. That is why, by the way, that "Jehovah" is a mistranslation and misunderstanding of the text—it contains the consonants for God's name (YHWH), but the vowels for the Hebrew word for "Lord." We sin against this commandment by blaspheming (mocking, ridiculing, despising God, His Church, the saints or holy objects)—this would be among the most serious of sins; irreverence in using the name of God, Jesus, or the saints—this is usually venial in nature; cursing (calling down evil upon another—this would be mortally sinful if the person were serious, but ordinarily the sinner is not; swearing (calling upon God to witness the truth of what we are saying, when what we are saying is not true or when there is not sufficient reason to call upon God)—perjury, or lying under oath, can be mortally sinful; and breaking a vow, which can be seriously or venially sinful, depending on how one is bound by the vow. As a small aside, our U.S. Constitution provides that when the President takes office, he or she must swear to uphold it, and since there was great respect for the Quakers then, who did not hold to any swearing, they were allowed to "affirm" rather than swear. Our only two Presidents of Quaker background, Herbert Hoover and Richard Nixon, chose to swear the oath. Thus we have the second commandment!
