Pastor's Notes:

The Pope's Intention for the month of September: For our relationship with all of creation. Let us pray that, inspired by St. Francis, we might experience our interdependence with all creatures who are loved by God and worthy of love and respect. Priest Day Intention: Pray for all seminarians, novices, and candidates. Thank you for your prayers!

Monday is Labor Day, a secular holiday, but a good day for us to remember the importance of work in our lives and in the lives of others—we all do something that contributes to the common good by what we do. Mass that day will be at 9 A.M. so you can begin the unofficial last day of summer with worship before your rest and relaxation (for most of you) with your family and friends. Enjoy!

I should remind you that the information I am sharing with you is largely taken from the *Life in Christ* catechism which most of you were given in Msgr. Witt's time—and there are still copies in the church which you may take if you wish. They are doing no good collecting dust.

The third commandment, the last of the "God" commandments (as the last seven are the "neighbor" commandments, has to do with keeping the Lord's Day holy. Most Christians keep the first day of the week holy (which is also the eighth day), since it was the day on which God began the work of creation of the world and also the new creation which began with the resurrection of Jesus at Easter. The Jewish day of rest, the Sabbath, is also the day on which God rested after the first creation was finished. We still observe Holy Saturday as the day of rest between the crucifixion and death of the Lord on Good Friday and the resurrection from the dead on Easter Sunday—the evening Mass on Holy Saturday should properly be called the Easter Vigil. As in the Jewish reckoning, a day begins at sunset and goes until sunset—that is why the Saturday night Mass all year is, in one sense, already being celebrated on Sunday. Seventh-Day Adventists and other "Sabbatarian" Christians still keep Saturday as their day of worship and rest. In the early Church, many of the first followers of Jesus were Jews and kept the Jewish Sabbath on Saturday, but worshipped with their fellow Christians on Sunday, the day of the resurrection. What is God asking us to do? First of all, He is asking for us to worship Him—that is why the Church helps us with this by asking us to attend Mass—otherwise, most would tend to skip making this day holy. Secondly, He is asking us to rest—we do not have to work all of the time, and, in fact, we need some rhythm in our lives that includes rest—so we can enjoy God and enjoy our families. We can nitpick about what we can and cannot do that day, but if we remember to keep holy the Lord's Day, we are on the right track.
