Pastor's Notes:

Thanks to all who took an hour out of their Sunday last week to witness to the sanctity of human life and to pray for our nation during the Life Chain. Just to show you how important you are, you are being counted this week (as you will be next) in the diocesan Mass census. God bless!

One final aspect concerning the Fifth Commandment about not killing was taught by the Lord Himself during the Sermon on the Mount (see Mt. 5:21f). Anger, although it is a normal human emotion and can even be "just" at times (as when the Lord cleansed the Temple of the moneychangers), can become sinful, especially when it leads to hatred, revenge, fighting and quarreling. In other words, it can easily lead down the dangerous path that ends with murder itself. Cain killed his brother Abel because of jealousy, and David arranged the death of Uriah because of lust, so there are other paths, but they are all related in that murder begins in the human heart and, to some degree, is rooted in the pride that led Adam and Eve to think that they knew better than their Creator.

We should mention here that racial or religious prejudice ("prejudging" someone) is usually treated under this commandment for similar reasons—the Nazi Party or the Ku Klux Klan are obvious examples of this kind of twisted thought. And we should also remember that we have no right to seek revenge or refuse to forgive injuries, also taught by our Savior. Scandal means evil actions, or actions which have the appearance of evil, leading to spiritual harm of another, especially the young (see Mark 9:42), and it can be serious if it results in serious harm to our neighbor. To wish serious evil to another, to cooperate with someone in a serious sin, to give serious scandal, or to talk or act against our neighbor in such a way as to injure someone seriously, can all be serious matter under this commandment (see *Life in Christ* catechism).

When we examine our consciences (a good practice at the end of each day), we should realize that this commandment involves a lot more than just the fact of whether or not I actually murdered someone. Amen!

I should interject at this point, that each commandment of the Ten Commandments can involve venial (slight) or mortal (deadly, serious) matter. All wrongdoings are sins, but not all sins are deadly (see 1 Jn. 5:16f). Mortal, or deadly sins, kill the life of grace in us. No sin is such that it cannot be forgiven by God, of course. That is why Christ gave us the Sacrament of Penance. It is a powerful aid to spiritual growth!
