

Pastor's Notes:

The work on the membranes at the foundation of the church has begun. The garage is full of things that are going to be used by the contractor and the work is scheduled to be finished by November 1. Thanks to Rick McConville for arranging this. It has been a long haul on this project—it started when Fr. Greg Pawloski was the pastor. Most projects like these have been taking a long time because of the labor shortage and the increased demand on contractors since the pandemic has receded. These membranes ensure that the foundation is waterproofed and they are standard (I am informed) on new buildings. Our foundations have been holding out pretty well, but when the automatic sprinklers were installed, it seems, the ground got too saturated and damage was started. Although we no longer use the sprinklers as much, now that we have the buffalo grass, we have been told (as you saw in the letter attached to the bulletin some weeks ago) that it is still a good idea to add these membranes. In addition, there will be a new water line installed between the hall the church, since the original one is rather old, and this will be an ideal time to replace it (since the contractor is bringing the proper equipment to dig holes). The water line is a separate, but relatively inexpensive addition that is being made to our agreement. I am no contractor myself, nor are any on the parish council, but many there have done a great deal of background checking and work to make sure that we are doing good things to keep our church building in good repair. I am impressed by their commitment and stewardship. They have fielded various questions from parishioners about what is going on, but they have also provided the leadership to make sure that necessary things get done. Although we do not have enough money pledged for the cost of the repair at this time, members are confident that we will have what we need when the final bill comes due (November?). Thanks to all who have already given toward this and God bless any who plan to do so in the near future. Forward we go and in good time for the celebration of the 100th anniversary of the dedication of our current church building on October 13, 2027.
