Enjoy reading with a grown up every day. Don't forget to ask them to sign your reading record and remember to bring it into school each day to get your reading stamp!

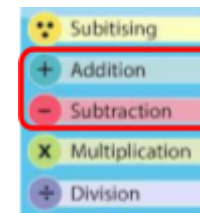
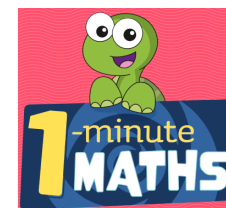


Be a Word Whizz!

Word	Definition
Bill of Rights	An important piece of paper that said the British Parliament could make laws and guide the King and Queen: William and Mary signed it when they became King and Queen.
Parliament	A group of people chosen to represent the people who live in a country (the parliament make decisions for the people)
Election	When people choose who they would like to be in parliament.
Prime Minister	The leader of the government.
Political Party	A group of people who make up the leading political party in the parliament.
Vote	A choice, marked on a piece of paper with a cross.
Budget	The government's plan to spend money on the things the country needs.
Services	Things that the government provide for the country, e.g. schools, hospitals, the police force and the fire service.
