English

Fiction. We will begin the half-term by using the classic picture book 'The Gruffalo' to retell and write stories in the present tense. We will then use the text 'Hansel and Gretel' by Anthony Browne to write detailed setting descriptions.

SPAG During these lessons we will be ensuring that capital letters are being used consistently and correctly. We will also learn how to punctuate sentences correctly with finger spaces and full stops.

We will know that a sentence is a complete idea.

Whole-Class Reading This half-term we will be developing our reading skills whilst reading 'Hansel and Gretel' by Anthony Browne.



PHSE- Health and well-being

This term children will learn what being healthy means and who helps them to stay healthy (e.g. parent, dentist, doctor). They will discuss how medicines and vaccinations can help us to stay healthy. They will explore why hygiene is important and how simple hygiene routines can stop germs from being passed on. Children will explain what they can do to take care of themselves on a daily basis, e.g. brushing teeth, hair, and hand washing.
