Be a regular reader!

Year 1's: Please practise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. **Challenge:** Use this knowledge to help you become more fluent when recalling your 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

Year 2's: Let's recap our 0, 1, 2, 5 and 10 times tables and learn our 3 times table! Remember to learn up to multiplications of 12.

You can practice these however you would like! You may wish to write these down for example; $1 \times 5 = 5$. Or you may wish to write yourself some questions and then answer them. If you do this you will be practising number formation too.

Be a Historian!

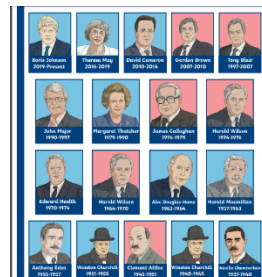
Become a Historian by using technology or other secondary sources safely to research about previous Prime Ministers. Pick a Prime Minister and write down five facts about them.

KEY VOCABULARY	
Bill of Rights	an important piece of paper that said the British Parliament could make laws and guide the King and Queen: William and Mary signed it when they became King and Queen
parliament	a group of people chosen to represent the people who live in a country (the parliament make decisions for the people)
election	when people choose who they would like to be in parliament
Prime Minister	the leader of the government
government	the group of people who make up the leading political party in the parliament
political party	a group of people who work together to gain power in parliament
vote	a choice, marked on a piece of paper with a cross
budget	the government's plan to spend money on things the country needs
services	things that the government provide for the country, e.g. schools, hospitals, the police force and the fire service
