Demonstrate your understanding of light to create your own drawing of a simple object you have at home. Don't forget to look closely at where the light is coming from and where the object casts shadows.

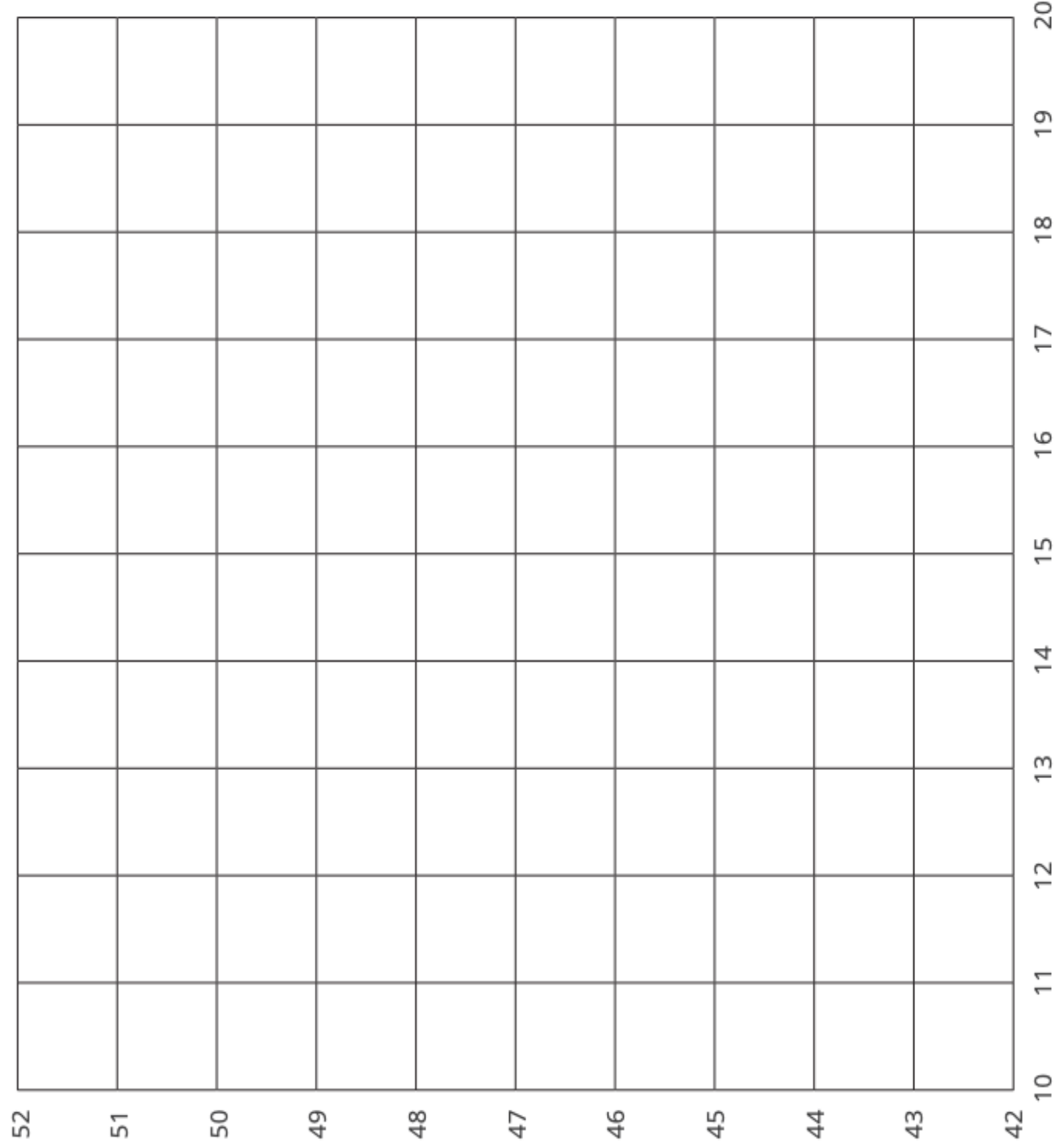
The homework grid should be completed within the half term. The compulsory tasks () must be completed each week. You then need to complete **at least** one additional task from each coloured column by the end of the half term.

- Work can be handed in for marking each Friday. All homework books are to be returned into school on Monday 3rd November 2025

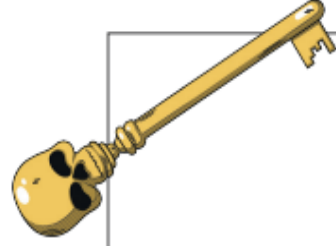
<u>History vocabulary</u>	<u>Geography vocabulary</u>
Ancient Greece – An ancient civilisation based around the Greek Peninsula and surrounding islands. Lines of Latitude – Imaginary lines that help us to identify how far north or south of the equator somewhere is. Spartan – People who lived in the city-state of Sparta. They were known for being great warriors.	Equator – An imaginary line that shows us the halfway point between the North and South Poles. The equator divides the earth into the Northern Hemisphere and the Southern Hemisphere.
Democracy – A system of government where people can vote to decide things. Athens was the first city-state to develop this system. Prime Meridian – The line of longitude that measures 0° and runs through Greenwich in London.	Prime Meridian – The line of longitude that measures 0° and runs through Greenwich in London.
Persia – An empire to the east of Greece, ruled by kings. Ancient Persia is in modern Iran. Tropic of Cancer – The most northerly line of latitude where the sun can be directly overhead. Named after the constellation of Cancer.	Tropic of Cancer – The most northerly line of latitude where the sun can be directly overhead. Named after the constellation of Cancer.
Olympics – A religious festival held in honour of the God Zeus. The Olympics was attended by people from all over Ancient Greece.	Tropic of Capricorn – The most southerly line of latitude where the sun can be directly overhead. Named after the constellation of Capricorn.
Legacy – Something that is part of our history and remains from an earlier time.	Scale – The relationship between the size of a map and the size of the real area that is represented by the map.
