Be a Regular Reader! ★

Please read every day. Read a range of books. Make sure that you read aloud too as this is a different skill. You will need to make a note of what you have read under each day in your diaries. Remember when you have **finished** a book, write a review or tell us about it.

Be a Word Whizz! ★

Practise the spellings you are given every Friday. You will need to look at these several times a week. We will test on the following Friday.

Be a Mathematician! ★

Log on to TIMES TABLE ROCK STARS and answer a minimum of 100 questions a week. We will check this on a Friday along with your average accuracy score. We will be looking for this to be above 90%. **We will be focusing on our 12 times table. Children should already know the 2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10 times table.**

Vocabulary quizzes

The Seekers will be having regular quizzes throughout the term to see if they have retained what they have been taught. Please revise the vocabulary on the back of this sheet and their definitions regularly ready for the quizzes!

History – The Stuarts

Write a diary entry as if you were someone who lived during the Great Plague. Use first person and describe the atmosphere of London during that time.
How would you feel? What would be happening around you? What would you see, hear or smell?

Science – Electricity

Draw an electrical circuit which includes: a battery, 2 wires and a light bulb.
Label the different components and explain what each component does within the circuit.

*What happens when another battery is added?
What happens if there are two bulbs? How many wires would be needed then?*

Latin – Roman gods

Name and label the Roman gods and next to this write the corresponding Greek god.

Draw pictures for each Roman god.



Math – Time poster

Complete a poster showing your knowledge about time.
How many seconds are there in a minute?

How many hours in a day?

How many days in a week?

How many weeks/months in a year?

Art – Needlework

Explain and show the different stitches we use for embroidery.

Can you demonstrate this with a needle and thread?



Geography – Japan

Create a travel guide about Japan.

RE – Pilgrimage

Research a pilgrimage from any religion and create a fact file about it.

Remember to include:

English – Shakespeare

History key vocabulary

Geography key vocabulary

divine right of kings	the belief that kings are chosen by God and therefore should have all the power
plot	a secret plan made by a group of people to do something illegal/harmful
the Gunpowder Plot	a plot, led by Robert Catesby, to blow up the Houses of Parliament on the 5th November 1605
Union of the Crowns	when King James VI of Scotland became King James I of England, this united the two kingdoms under one crown
civil war	a war between people from the same country
treason	a crime where a person betrays their country (this includes trying to kill their king)
commonwealth	an old word for a government created for the good of the people
Royalist	also known as Cavaliers: fought on the side of King Charles I during the English Civil War
Parliamentarian	also known as the Roundheads: fought on the side of Parliament during the English Civil War
the Restoration	The Restoration of 1660 marked the return of Charles II to the throne after the Commonwealth (when England didn't have a king)
bubonic plague	a disease which causes painful, swollen lumps, black hands and feet and flu-like symptoms
Catholic	a form of Christianity : in Catholicism, the Bible is in Latin, the Pope is head of the church , and churches are beautifully decorated with lots of gold and paintings
Protestant	a form of Christianity : Protestants have simpler churches without decorations, and the pope is not in charge

Land of the Rising Sun	the name sometimes given to Japan because of the sun rising in the east and it being the most Eastern area in Asia
Tokyo	the capital city of Japan
Kyoto	a large city in Honshu, Japan: it was the capital city of Japan
climate	the average weather in a place over many years
weather	the condition of the atmosphere at a particular time, e.g rain, snow, sunny
tsunami	unusually large sea waves caused by either earthquakes, seaquakes or underwater volcanic eruption
monsoon	wind systems that bring heavy rains in summer and winter
samurai	Japanese army warriors
kimono	a long, loose traditional Japanese robe with wide sleeves and tied with a sash
origami	a Japanese art of folding paper to make decorative shapes and figures
