Be a Regular Reader! ★

Please read every day and read a range of books. Make sure that you read aloud too as this is a different skill. You will need to make a note of what you have read under each day in your diaries. Remember when you have finished a book write a review or tell us about it.

Be a Word Whizz! ★

Practise the spellings you are given every Friday. You will need to look at these several times a week. We will test on the following Fridays (as a dictation).

Be a Mathematician! ★

Log on to TIMES TABLE ROCK STARS and answer a minimum of 100 questions a week. We will check this on a Friday along with your average accuracy score. We will be looking for this to be above 90%. If you have trouble accessing TTRockstars at home, you can use an iPad at break or lunch times.

The French Revolution		UK Geography	
Revolution	a time when people, ruled or governed by a power, overthrow that power and try to change how people live and work	Industry	Activity where raw materials are changed into goods that can be used and traded.
Absolute monarchy	when a king or queen is in complete control and doesn't need to follow any rules or laws	Arable farming	Farming where crops are planted, tended to and then harvested.
Republic	a country governed by elected representatives , not by a king or queen	Pastoral farming	Farming where animals are raised and used for food or other produce such as wool.
Clergy	people who have a role within the church , e.g. Catholic Priest	Mining	Where a raw resource is extracted from the earth , for example, coal.
Nobles	wealthy people from families who are considered important	National Park	An area protected by laws to ensure land is preserved.
Debt	a sum of money that is owed	Viaduct	A type of bridge built across a valley to allow transport to cross from one side to another.
Exile	when a person is banned from living in a country , often used as a punishment	Valley	The low-lying land between mountains or hills.
Allied	joined together , countries sometimes join together to fight in wars	Relief Map	A map showing the shape and height of land.
The Bastille	a prison in Paris used by the French kings	Population	The number of people living in a specific area.
Battle of Trafalgar	a battle that took place off the coast of Spain between the French and the British navy: it was won by the British admiral, Nelson, who defeated Napoleon and prevented a French invasion of Britain	Topography	The surface features in an area of land, e.g. hills, mountains, valleys, lakes and rivers. Topography can also include features made by humans such as viaducts, dams, roads, and even cities.
