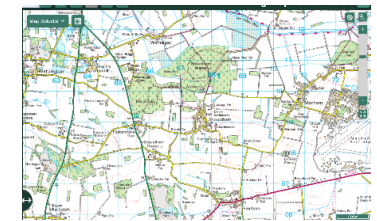




Home Learning Tasks (Voyagers)

Be a Regular Reader! ★

Please read every day. Read a range of books. Make sure that you read aloud too as this is a different skill. You will need to make a note of what you have read under each day in your diaries. Remember when you have finished a book, write a review or tell us about it.

Be a Word Whizz! ★

Practise the spellings you are given every Friday. You will need to look at these several times a week. We will test on the following Fridays (as a dictation).

Be a Mathematician! ★

Log on to TIMES TABLE ROCK STARS or TACKLING TABLES and answer a minimum of 100 questions a week. We will check this on a Friday along with your average accuracy score. We will be looking for this to be above 90%. If you have trouble accessing this at home, you can use an iPad at break or lunch times.

The Victorian Age		Local Study	
Victorian Age	the period of Queen Victoria's reign , from 20 June 1837 until her death on 22 January 1901	sketch map	a simple, hand drawn map , from sight or memory, showing the key human and physical features in an area
Industrial Revolution	the Industrial Revolution began in the 18th century and describes the move from hand manufacturing and human or animal power, to machinery	graph	a mathematical drawing that shows information using lines, shapes and colours
urbanisation	industrialisation caused people to move (migrate) from the countryside to towns and cities	analyse	to look closely at something and understand it
slum	an urban area where poor people lived in cramped and dirty conditions	data	information, often facts or numbers , that can be collected and analysed to help us understand something
cholera	an infectious disease that causes severe vomiting and diarrhoea (caused by dirty water)	fieldwork	the process of observing and collecting data about people, cultures and natural environments
		local councillor	a person elected to a local council to represent the views of local residents
		resident	someone who lives in a particular place
workhouse	a place where poor people were sent to live and work : they were like prisons, and people were treated very badly		
The Great Exhibition	an international exhibition that was held at Crystal Palace to showcase industrial and technological advances from around the world
