- Conjunction is a Latin word!
- "con" comes from "cum" which means "with" or "together"
- $\bullet$  "junction" comes from "iungo" (a form of this Verb is "iunctus") which means "join"
- $\bullet$  So a CONJUNCTION is something that JOINS two things TOGETHER!
