Latin conjunctions

• et	• and
• sed	• but
• quod	• because
• quamquam	• although



- Conjunction is a Latin word!
- “con” comes from “cum” which means “with” or “together”
- “junction” comes from “iungo” (a form of this Verb is “iunctus”) which means “join”
- So a CONJUNCTION is something that JOINS two things TOGETHER!
