Religious people have used different technology throughout history
The first printed text was produced in China around 868CE
Johannes Gutenberg was the first person in Europe to develop a printing press in the 1440s
William Tyndale was one of the first people to translate the Bible into English
The printing press is closely linked to the Protestant Reformation in Europe
The use of printing technology by Christians led to both good and bad things

What the unit covers...

Continuing to build on learning from this year, pupils explore the impact of the printing press on Christian and non-religious worldviews. Using historical questions and skills to engage with the story of William Tyndale, pupils address philosophical questions about the use of technology by religious worldviews.

Evidence of pupil knowledge can be recorded in a number of ways, including through written work, oracy and reflective activities.
