Room #5 - Three/Four Year Olds

Aloha! Welcome to Hawaii! Did you know that in Hawaiian the word "aloha" means hello and goodbye? That is just one of the fun facts we will be learning as we embark on our Hawaiian adventure!

The surfing will be "maxed out" (as the cool surfers say), as we pretend to surf using the balance beam and create our own individual surfboards. Surf's up dude, this is going to be fun!

We will be learning about the Big Island, Maui and Oahu as well as some of the most famous beaches in Hawaii including Waikiki Beach and Hapuna Beach. During this time, we will talk about all the fun things that can be done on beaches - even here in Rhode Island! We will discuss beach safety and the importance of using sunscreen!

Did you know that the Monk Seal is only found in Hawaii? That's just one of the countless totally awesome animals that live on the Hawaiian Islands! Some of the ones we will learn about include Spinner Dolphins, Hawaiian Hoary Bats and Hawksbill Sea Turtles. We will learn what it means that these animals are endangered, and what we can do keep these beautiful creatures around for many years to come.

Lastly, we will talk about the ways our classroom can embody what the Hawaiians call "Aloha Spirit." This is a feeling that everyone is welcomed and appreciated and free to be themselves. Everyone is Ohana, (family). We hope you will catch the Aloha Spirit by the end of the Summer when we will have a Room 5 Luau com-



plete with learning how to hula and trying delicious Hawaiian foods! We can't wait for the Hawaiian fun to begin! It is going to be an epic Summer in Room 5!

Room #1 - Four/Five Year Olds

Pack your sunscreen and swim gear as you get ready to spend your summer here at the SELC Beach. From sand to sea, our aspiring oceanographers will be immersed in engag-



ing explorations of the Earth's oceans, including the water itself, and the plants and animals that live there.

Our oceanographer training begins by learning (singing) about the 5 oceans of the world and answering the question, "What makes a body of water an ocean?". We will conduct experiments to determine the properties of salt water versus freshwater, and we will discover how items are able to float in saltwater due to its density.

Scuba gear is required as we dive deep into the sea, exploring the amazing plants and animals that make up an ocean ecosystem. We will document and recreate our findings by setting up models of this underwater world in our sensory tables and dramatic play area and by creating 2- and 3-dimensional models of some of the creatures we learn about.

As the summer progresses, we will move closer inland, through coral reefs and tide pools. We are even going to recreate a tide pool ecosystem right within our classroom for our budding scientists to study!

By the end of the summer, the children will be well on their way to being this generation's Jacques Cousteau!



Our program also incorporates STEAM, which stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics. STEAM education programs aim to teach students to think critically and have an engineering and design approach towards real-world problems while building on their mathematics and science base. STEAM programs add art to STEM curriculum by drawing on design principles and encouraging creative solutions.
