Day 1: Saturday 1st August 2026 - Canada to England

Overnight flight to London

Day 2: Sunday 2nd August 2026 - London (L,D)

Morning arrival into London Heathrow. Meet your step on tour guide, tour leader and coach.

Lunch stop included as part of your tour.

Embark on a **2 hour panoramic coach tour of London** with highlights including the Houses of Parliament and Buckingham Palace. Visit the Tower of London for guided tour by one of the historical guards of the tower, the Yeoman Warders or known affectionately as **'Beefeaters'** with a viewing of the crown jewels.

Transfer to your hotel to check in and overnight, dinner in the hotel.

Day 3 - Monday 3rd August 2026 - London (B,D)

Breakfast at your hotel

Depart by coach to **St Paul's Cathedral for a tour, visit the Imperial War Museum, Churchill War Rooms and HMS Belfast.** Dinner in a local restaurant, return to the hotel for overnight.

Day 4 - Tuesday 4th August 2026 - London (B,L)

Breakfast.

Visit a 5,500 acre cereal operation that has diversified with **educational farm park, craft centre and restaurant**. Spread over 2 farms in Suffolk and Essex the centre attracts up to 15,000 visitors per year. Farm contracts with grassland management and concentrate. Good farming operation with excellent diversification planning.

Lunch in the farm restaurant.

Return to central London for a cruise on the Thames and enjoy the sights including The Tower of London, HMS Belfast, Docklands Financial Centre and The Royal Naval College Greenwich.

Dinner under own arrangements.

<u>Day 5 – Wednesday 5th August 2026 – London to Salisbury (B,L)</u>

Breakfast and check out.

Depart to **Waddeson Manor**, **owned by Baron Rothschild**, built in the style of a French Chateaux and home to the family's collection of stunning artwork, porcelain, wine cellar and magnificent gardens. Wine and Dining experience included subject to availability.

Continue to Salisbury with a visit to a **major cereal farm enroute**. The farming business encompassing 3,200 acres . Meet the farm manager for a tour of the property that consists of 9,000 acres of cereal production growing wheat , barley , oil seed rape , maize , linseed and lucerne on a low till basis, operating a wide range of agricultural machinery . This visit provides the opportunity to hear about the rotation policy and target markets for crops and business decision making on selection of machinery types to support a large farming enterprise . Arrive Salisbury and check in for a 2 night stay.

Overnight: Salisbury

Day 6 - Thursday 6th August 2026 - Salisbury (B,D)

Breakfast.

Depart to **Stonehenge** for a visit of this prehistoric megalithic structure on Salisbury Plain.

The tour is done using a free app that can be downloaded to individual phones and is available in 20 different languages.

Lunch at the Stonehenge café under own arrangements.

Depart to visit an **organic 5th generation farm** on the edge of the Salisbury Plain that has pedigree rare and native breeds of sheep and cattle such as: Castle Milk Moorit, Reyland, White Park, Lleyn, and Manx Loaghtan as well as a small herd of traditional Hereford.

Make a second farm visit to a **family run mixed operational farm.** Their operation consists of beef, sheep and crops. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

Overnight: Salisbury





Day 7 - Friday 7th August 2026 - Salisbury to Stratford Upon Avon (B,L,D)

Breakfast and check out.

Depart north towards Stratford Upon Avon. **Visit an organic crop & livestock farm owned by Helen Browning**, the head of The Soil Association that supports policy makers, farmers, foresters and citizens to make better decisions about how we eat, farm and care for the natural world. Better known for their high welfare organic pork, this farm has recently introduced a beef herd as they recognise the importance of pasture fed livestock in improving soils and maintaining the grasslands that harbour so much wildlife.

Early lunch in the pub located on the farm and is owned by the Helen Browning group and is part of their community support policy.

Depart to **Bovine Genetics** and meet Stella Scholes, head of the company. She has extensive knowledge of the beef industry and has been working with bovine embryos since 1985 both nationally and internationally. The independent company is a specialist embryo collector and producer and is one of the leading companies in its field in the UK. Their aim is to produce the highest quality embryos with outstanding success rates to boost herds profitability and widen the genetic base. Continue to Stratford to check into your city centre hotel for a 3 night stay. Dinner under own arrangements.

Overnight: Stratford Upon Avon

<u>Day 8 – Saturday 8th August 2026 – Stratford Upon Avon (B,D)</u>

Breakfast.

Spend the day at the Canwell Show, one of the Midlands' largest and oldest one-day agricultural events.

This is a traditional local agricultural show with judging for all types of livestock, trade stands, countryside events and food stalls. Lunch under own arrangements.

Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

Overnight: Stratford Upon Avon


Day 7 - Sunday 9th August 2026 - Stratford Upon Avon (B,D)

Breakfast.

Guided tour of Stratford Upon Avon, birthplace of the famous bard William Shakespeare.

Visit the house where he was born and grew up and Ann Hathaway Cottage, part of the Shakespeare property trust. The cottage is an historical museum dedicated to farming in the Elizabethan era and was where his wife grew up. Return to the hotel to freshen up. **Depart to the dock to board your dinner cruise on the River Avon.** Return to the hotel for overnight.

Overnight: Stratford Upon Avon





<u>Day 8 – Monday 10th August 2026 – Stratford Upon Avon to Liverpool (B,L,D)</u>

Breakfast and check out.

Depart towards Liverpool. Visit to a farm that is being run by two **entrepreneurial Shropshire Brothers**. Together the brothers brought the world's first sowing and weeding robot to the UK and use this technology across 5 partner farms. The Drone is controlled by precise GPS Technology that undertakes both sowing and weeding in and between the rows. The Farm Droid is an entirely self-sufficient robot driven by batteries that are powered by solar panels making it a carbon-

Visit an organic **Longhorn beef farm** that specialise in rearing English Longhorn cattle that are reared and live a relaxed, stress-free existence on the fields next to the River Severn, just upstream from the market town of Shrewsbury, Shropshire.

Visit the premier **Wagyu Beef operation** in the UK with its diversification in on-liner meat delivery service from its own herd. Lunch on the farm included.

Continue to Liverpool to check in and overnight.

Overnight: Liverpool

Day 9 - Tuesday 11th August 2026 - Liverpool (B,D)

Breakfast.

Meet your step on Guide for a **Liverpool City and Beatles magical mystery tour** as you discover the locations within Liverpool made famous by the Beatles group members and their songs.

The group will be dropped off in the city centre close to the **Cavern Club**, where they can gain entrance to the club with their tour ticket and enjoy the musical experience and the historic memorabilia on offer. Lunch under own arrangements. Return to the hotel under own arrangements and enjoy dinner in the hotel.

Overnight: Liverpool

Day 10 - Wednesday 12th August 2026 - Liverpool to Cardiff (B,D)

Breakfast and check out.

Depart to Welshpool to visit the **livestock market**. A charter that was granted in the 13th century first gave the town of Welshpool the right to hold a weekly market on a Monday and in 1863 the Smithfield Livestock Market was established. The market spent well over a century at its old home. Now a 16-acre site on the outskirts of the town, the new multi-million-pound Livestock Marketing Centre is the home of Welshpool Livestock Sales and it is one of the most important livestock markets in the UK. Transforming the future of trading, the livestock building extends to 3.25 acres and can hold in excess of 1,200 cattle and 15,000 sheep. Lunch under own arrangements prior to departure.

Visit a farm with stunning views of the Brecon Beacons and specialises in producing venison

and its own lamb, beef and locally produced meat as well as deli items, bread and gifts for its Beacons

Farm Shop. Continue to Cardiff to check in for a 1 night stay.

Overnight: Liverpool





Day 11 - Thursday 13 August 2026 - Cardiff to Bath (B,L,D)

Breakfast and check out. Depart to Cheddar Gorge in Somerset. Visit a farm that is part of the Duchy of Cornwall's Newton Estate. It is a 320-acre arable farm situated between Bath and Bristol, just south of the Cotswolds. In keeping with the organic enthusiasm of King Charles, the managers are passionate about producing conventional crops; wheat and barley to the niche crops; red and white quinoa along with grapes from the vineyard. They strive to nurture and enhance the wildlife on the farm and create a beautiful and tranquil setting for outdoor dining and location hire. Lunch in a local pub.

Visit the **Cheddar Gorge Cheese Company factory** to see the production of the unique Cheddar cheese. The cheese company produce their cheese from milk provided exclusively by one local dairy farm and produce a specialist cheddar cheese that is sold both internationally and to UK markets. Continue to Bath to check in to your city centre hotel.

Overnight: Bath

Day 12 - Friday 14 August 2026 - Bath (B,L,D)

Breakfast and check out. **Guided tour of Bath and the Roman Baths.** Depart to the Cotswold's to one of the **largest recorded pedigree Beef Shorthorn herds in England** with several pedigree stock bulls to compliment the types of cows they run at the farm. Lunch in a local pub. Continue to Windsor and Check in to your hotel and overnight.

Farewell Dinner in a local restaurant.

Overnight: Windsor

Day 13 - Saturday 15 August 2026 - Windsor (B)

Breakfast and check out. **Guided Tour of Windsor Castle** and enjoy some free time to explore this picturesque town and do some final last minute shopping. Lunch under own arrangements. Transfer to the airport for your return flight.
