# INTRODUCTION

We are proud to celebrate the extraordinary recipients of the Gamma Mu Foundation's 2025 grants and scholarships. Thanks to the dedication of the grassroots organizations we support and the resilience of our scholarship recipients, lasting change is taking root in rural and underserved LGBTQ+ communities nationwide. As the only national LGBTQ+ foundation explicitly dedicated to these populations, we are honored to stand alongside them, ensuring vital resources reach those advancing equity and inclusion every day.

Since our founding in 1988 by members of the Gamma Mu Social Fraternity, the Foundation has raised more than \$10 million to advance LGBTQ+ equality. By the end of 2025, we will have distributed over \$5 million in grants and scholarships, transforming lives and strengthening communities nationwide. Last year, more than 150 individual donors, both recurring and new, joined together to make our work possible, showing that every act of generosity creates lasting change.

Over the decades, this commitment has fueled remarkable growth. Since 1988, the Foundation has awarded 581 grants totaling more than \$4 million to 291 organizations in all 50 states, Washington, D.C., and Puerto Rico. What began in 2000 with just two modest scholarships has now grown to 426 scholarships awarded, valued at more than \$1 million. Each award reflects the belief that education and service can change lives, made possible through the generosity of our donor community.

In 2025 alone, the Foundation distributed \$353,399 through 21 grants and 47 scholarships. This amount represents a 51% increase in funding since 2020 and demonstrates the expanding reach of our programs. Nearly every dollar donated goes directly to recipients, ensuring that change remains at the heart of everything we do.



# **GRANTS PROGRAM**

In 2025, the Foundation awarded \$200,971 through 21 grants to strengthen nonprofits serving rural and underserved LGBTQ+ communities. These awards advanced 10 Community Support Services projects, 10 HIV and Health Initiatives, and 1 Public Education and Research project, each contributing to the health, dignity, and well-being of LGBTQ+ individuals nationwide.

This year marked a strategic shift. While fewer grants were awarded, each selected organization received increased funding compared to previous years, thereby carrying greater potential for meaningful change. Sixteen organizations previously funded by the Foundation received renewed support, reinforcing partnerships with proven community leaders. Engagement also reached new heights, with more than 200 participants joining pre-application webinars to strengthen proposals. Following the grant awards, a post-application webinar provided feedback to those not selected, equipping them with tools and insight to prepare stronger applications in the future.

The review process also advanced to ensure fairness and consistency. Thirteen volunteer reviewers from within our donor community, up from eleven the year before, brought a balanced mix of new perspectives and returning experience. Weighted scoring questions added structure and equity, allowing applications to be assessed on a level playing field. These improvements strengthened confidence among applicants and assured donors that their contributions are supporting the projects with the greatest impact.



# **SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

For the 2025 academic year, the Foundation awarded 47 scholarships totaling \$160,000. This total included 16 Named Scholarships at \$5,000 each and 31 scholarships at \$2,500 each. Among this year's recipients were 20 graduate students and 27 undergraduates, each moving closer to educational and professional goals with less financial strain.

This year's recipients represent 43 hometowns across the country, from small rural towns of only a few thousand residents to large metropolitan centers. Nearly two-thirds grew up in communities of fewer than 50,000, where resources for LGBTQ+ youth are often scarce. Students from larger cities also faced challenges, including housing insecurity and discrimination. Collectively, their stories highlight resilience, determination, and the power of opportunity. The Foundation is proud to stand beside them as they continue creating change in their lives and communities.

This commitment reflects our dedication to supporting a diverse cross-section of the LGBTQ+ community and ensuring that students from all regions and backgrounds have access to transformative educational opportunities.



# **LOOKING AHEAD**

As we celebrate these milestones, we remain focused on the work ahead. In 2026, the Foundation will continue expanding opportunities for both grantees and scholars, building on the progress of recent years. Priorities include broadening Named Scholarships, expanding outreach to applicants in rural areas, and increasing investments in community-based organizations that address needs such as mental health, aging, documenting our history, and inclusive education.

Most importantly, we will continue to direct nearly every dollar donated to those we serve. Through the steadfast generosity of our donor family, the Gamma Mu Foundation will continue to be a vital lifeline for LGBTQ+ individuals and organizations nationwide, demonstrating once again that together we can create lasting change and stronger, more inclusive communities.

# **MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIR**

This year has been a highlight of my Gamma Mu Foundation Grants program service. We offered grant webinars for the first time to applicants, and over 200 registered. Participation demonstrated the LGBTQ+ community's growing need for services and increased awareness of our program, particularly in rural and underserved areas.

Passion permeated the application procedure. A record 220 grant applications were submitted, our most ever. Equally significant, the applications' overall quality showed a noticeable rise in competitiveness and quality, with higher weighted scores overall. These outcomes demonstrate the commitment of the applicant organizations as well as their faith in the Foundation's capacity to have a substantial impact.

The stories behind these data stand out. These applications show the challenges and resiliency of our community, from young people suffering isolation to seniors in need of affirming housing to communities still addressing HIV prevention and care. Reading the applications serves as a reminder that our awards offer more than just financial support; they also provide hope and validation.

I'm proud to lead a program that gives voice to those who are often overlooked and directs resources to create lasting impact. Our donors, whose kindness makes this possible, have my equal gratitude. Your ongoing assistance bolsters our capacity to compassionately and resolutely address growing needs, ranging from housing and mental health to HIV prevention and care.

This year has been one of the most rewarding I've experienced with the Gamma Mu Foundation's scholarship program. We awarded 47 scholarships totaling \$160,000, an increase of 12 awards and \$35,000 from last year. Among the recipients are 10 freshmen, 15 undergraduates, 20 graduate students, and 2 LGBTQ+ students, each now facing less financial strain as they pursue their education. It was also especially meaningful to present the Cliff Pettit Founder Award to a scholarship recipient for the first time, honoring our past while investing in our future.

I am especially proud of the improvements we made to the scholarship process. We added new application questions, including whether recipients are first-generation students or face significant financial need, to better understand our applicants. In their follow-up forms, students were invited to share personal remarks of gratitude, many of which you'll see later in this booklet. We also reached out to each of our Named Scholarship donors, sharing information about the student whose life they helped change. In total, 16 Named Scholarships were awarded this year, deepening the bond between donors and recipients.

Every application carries a story of courage, resilience, and hope. Our scholarships provide more than financial aid. They affirm the voices and potential of these students. Each award validates their worth and inspires them to lead, achieve, and dream bigger. By investing in education, we are easing financial burdens while nurturing future leaders who will help create a more open and welcoming society for us all.


