Description of Classes

Class 1: Proven Life

(Connect + Cultivate)

- Staying connected to Christ (John 15:4)
- Prioritizing spiritual training and joy over performance (John 15:8)
- Practical: How to use FCA resources in your school.

Class 2: Proven Love

(Choose + Commit)

- Loving others sacrificially in your school (John 15:12)
- Resilience in adversity and listening to the Spirit (John 15:19)
- Practical: Leading a Huddle and showing Christ's love in tough situations.

Class 3: Proven Mission

(Global Outreach + Ministry Game Plan)

- How to develop a Ministry Game Plan for your campus.
- FCA's global vision and Mission to India.
- Practical: Steps to start a ministry plan and connect with global FCA opportunities.

STRATEGIC SUGGESTIONS (Highly Recommended)

1. Student Teaching Teams

- 2–3 students per breakout
- One teaches, one facilitates discussion, one shares testimony
- Adult FCA leader present only to support—not lead

2. Interactive Elements

- Short discussion questions

- “Write it down” moments in the handbook
- One clear action step per session

3. Color-Code Rotation

- Wristbands or stickers (Red / Blue / Yellow)
- Makes rotation smooth and eliminates confusion

4. Clear Call to Action

End the night with:

- “Start or strengthen your FCA huddle”
- “Commit to discipling one person”
- “Pray for and support the mission to India”

5. Optional Add-On

- QR code linking to:
 - FCA resources
 - Mission to India info
 - Next FCA events

Students who do not have their “After 9s” will be released accordingly, but let’s encourage them to carpool or have parents to drop them off at the FCA Educational Center.
