THEME 2026-2027 LIVE BY THE SPIRIT

In St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, Chapter 4, Verse 32, he says, "Be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ." Jesus asked His disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" This week, think about what you would say if Jesus asked you, "Who do you say that I am?"

Prayer for the week: *Create in me a humble and clean heart, dear Jesus. When You speak to me, I want to hear Your voice and follow You in all that I do. Amen.*

WEEK 2: AUGUST 24TH-28TH (ORDINARY TIME)

Verse from the Gospel: "What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? Or what can one give in exchange for his life?" (Matthew 16: 26)

Word of the week: forfeit

Jesus said that in order to follow Him we must take up a cross, lose our lives in order not to forfeit them. Think about what the obstacle is that keeps you from giving your life fully to Jesus?

Prayer for the week: *Lord Jesus, I want to live according to Your ways, not the ways of the world. Help me overcome selfishness to be more like You. Amen.*

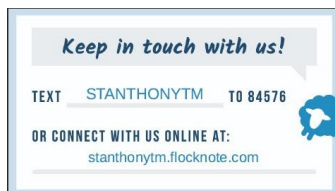
Our Latino Festival

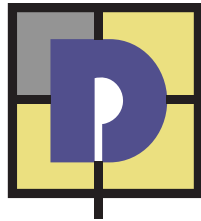


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
