Icebreaker

What's something you've read (book, text, email, etc) that unexpectedly impacted you more than you thought it would?

Scripture Reference

1 Chronicles 1:1-4; Matthew 4:4; Genesis 1:1-2

Intro

Pastor Bobby opened the message with a list of Genealogies?

Be honest, do you read the genealogies? Why or why not?

Do you think they are important? If yes, why do people normally skip over them?

Pastor Bobby said:

"The Bible isn't just rules, but life-giving."

Do you believe this? Why or why not? What does the Bible mean to you?

Have you experienced the life-giving nature of the Bible? What experience do you have with the life it gives?

Do you tend to approach scripture as more informational or transformational?

Pastor Bobby told us that the genealogy that was read in 1 Chronicles spelled out:

"Man, having become thoroughly wicked, mourned; the light

of God came down... and through His death, He comforted the poor and oppressed."

What did you think of that? Had you ever heard anything like that before? What part hit you the most?

Pastor Bobby encouraged us to not live not on bread alone, but on every Word that proceeds from the mouth of God.

What is an area of your life you have been "living on bread alone" instead of the Word of God? What part(s) of your life are you trying to control or live in your own strength that you need to give to God?

Challenge:

What is one practical way you can engage Scripture more intentionally this week?

Who is someone in your life that needs encouragement that God hasn't forgotten about them?
