OPERATIONAL STANDARDS

14. Before an Alarm Permit will be issued, the device must meet the following operational standards:

- i. If an Alarm Device is designed to transmit a recorded message, the contents of said message shall be intelligible.
- ii. If an Alarm Device is designed to cause an exterior bell, siren, or other sound making device to be activated on or near the premises on which the Alarm Device is installed at the time it gives an alarm, said Alarm Device shall be designed to de-activate the bell, siren, or other sound-making device after a maximum of twenty (20) minutes of operation.
- iii. The sensory mechanism used in connection with an Alarm Device must be installed and adjusted to suppress false indication of fire, smoke, or intrusion.
- iv. The Alarm Device must be maintained by the Permit Holder in good repair to assure reliability of operation.

15. It is the responsibility of the applicant or owner of the Alarm Device to keep all required emergency contact information current by promptly notifying the Police Department of any changes. Failure to do so constitutes a violation of the Alarm Device Ordinance.
