This position is ideal for an educator who believes that wellness education extends beyond traditional physical education and embraces the physical, emotional, social, and spiritual dimensions of well-being. As Fontbonne continues to expand and refine its wellness programming, the successful candidate will have the opportunity to contribute ideas, develop new initiatives, and help shape the future direction of wellness education across grades 7–12.

- Serve as a visible and positive advocate for wellness throughout the school community for both students and adults.

- Teaching experience in wellness education, health education, physical education, recreation, youth development, coaching, or related fields preferred.
- Strong understanding of adolescent development, particularly the social, emotional, physical, and wellness needs of adolescent girls.
- Ability to build positive relationships with students across grades 7–12.
- Demonstrated commitment to inclusive and student-centered practices.
