A few days ago, I was watching the snow fall, from my window and I wondered; Are there really 'no two snowflakes that are alike'? So, I had to look it up and google told me, "That each snowflake is formed under distinct conditions, influenced by temperature, humidity, and the presence of mineral particles, leading to a unique

history and crystalline shape for every snowflake. 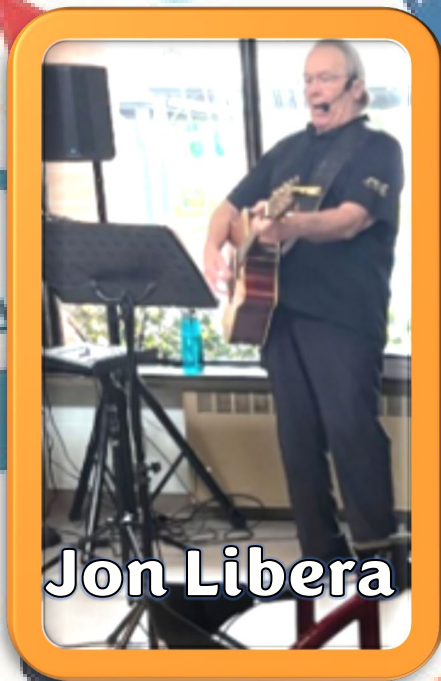

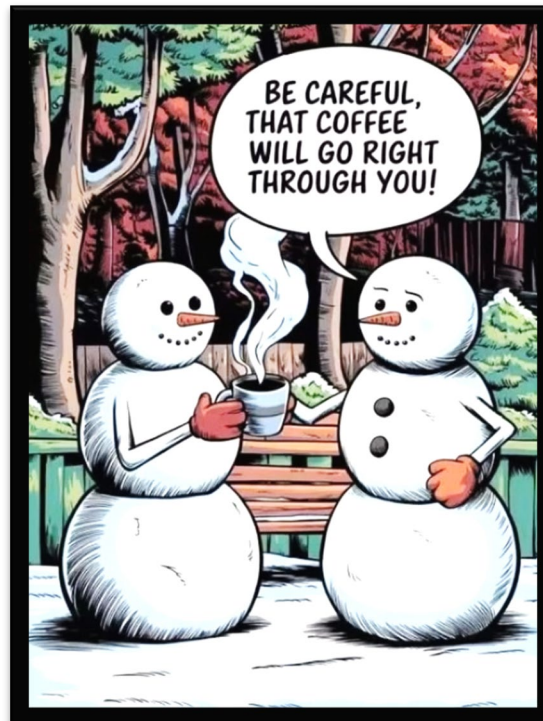
