## From the Pastor's desk....



**St. Vincent de Paul Joliet Diocesan Council Announces Closure of Addison and Morris Thrift Stores**

**JOLIET, IL** — The Society of St. Vincent de Paul Joliet Diocesan Council announced today that it will close its two remaining thrift store locations in Addison and Morris effective **June 30, 2026**. The decision follows a unanimous vote of the Council, with one abstention, after several years of financial losses and extensive consultation with local parish Conferences.

Rooted in its mission as “a network of friends, inspired by Gospel values, growing in holiness and building a more just world through personal relationships with and service to people in need,” the Council affirmed that the decision allows the organization to focus more directly on neighbor-to-neighbor assistance through parish-based Conferences.

“The Society of St. Vincent de Paul Joliet Diocesan Council is fully committed to our mission,” said Helen T. McCullough, President. “While the stores have served our community for many years, continuing financial challenges require us to redirect our resources to our mission. As Vincentians conferences, we believe in meeting people where they are, offering not only practical help but also a listening ear and a compassionate heart. Through personal encounters, we strive to build relationships that reflect Christ’s love and dignity for every person”.

**Discontinuation of Clothing Drives and Drop Boxes**

With the closure of the stores, all Council-directed clothing drives and drop boxes will be discontinued immediately. Clothing drives have historically supplied store inventory, but without retail operations they are no longer needed. Donations will continue to be accepted at the Addison and Morris locations through the spring of 2026. After that time, donations of clothing, furniture, and household goods will not be accepted. Drop boxes located on Parish grounds will be removed and recycled or sold.

**Impact on Programs**

The Basic Needs and Furniture Purchase Programs connected to the stores will end on June 30, 2026. However, the Council emphasized that essential charitable services will continue through local Conferences, including:

- Operation of food pantries and holiday meal and gift programs
- Distribution of grocery gift cards
- Assistance with rent and utility payments
- Help with car repairs
- Parish-based “clothes closets” and other local ministries



**Commitment to the Future**

The Council remains committed to expanding Conferences in underserved areas of the Joliet Diocese and strengthening the spiritual and charitable works of existing Conferences.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul thanks their dedicated employees, volunteers, donors, and community partners for their faithful support and invites continued generosity as it enters this new chapter of service.
