
From the Pastor's desk....


This weekend we move our clocks ahead 1 hour; we see more daylight at the end of the day, and are reminded winter is ending and spring is beginning! This also tells us that Easter is approaching. I pray that your Lenten season so far has been going well for you. May you continue on this journey towards the holy mountain of Easter where we experience the light of Christ.

Lent is also a time where people will often come and make their "Easter Duty"—a term that was once used as a reminder to go to confession before Easter! This sacrament is a beautiful gift for our faith. We confess our sins to the priest, and with the presence of the Holy Spirit, God's grace is given to us to guide us and keep us on the path towards salvation. We have a special opportunity here in this area of our diocese once again with confession. Coming up on Saturday, March 21, we will have the Lenten Deanery Reconciliation event at Immaculate Conception Church in Elmhurst. It is hoped that people from all over our deanery will come to IC that day and receive the sacrament of reconciliation. There should be 4 priests present between 8:00 in the morning to 3:00 in the afternoon. You can come and choose a priest; some will be in the traditional confessional, others will be behind a screen or you may also go face-to-face.

Many people find this annual event beneficial. We also have this during the season of Advent. So, think about it. If you are looking for something extra to do for Lent, and if it has been awhile since you have gone to confession, this may be very helpful for you.

We will look at the fifth essential separately, because it holds all the others together.

The 4th Pillar - Communion

After conversion and confession, communion continues the transformative process of disciple-making. By “communion,” I mean nothing less than the Eucharist, Jesus’ gift of Himself — Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity — to the life of the Church. In a very tangible way, the Church in the United States has reawakened to the significance of Holy Communion, thanks in part to the three-year Eucharistic Revival which culminated more than a year ago, when 60,000 Catholics, including many from our own diocese, gathered in Indianapolis for the Tenth National Eucharistic Congress. The Eucharist is the source and summit of the whole Christian life, making disciples through personal transformation. Jesus comes to us in the Eucharist because this is His way of wanting to be in communion with you. We remember these words from the Gospel of John: “Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me” (John 6:54). To put it another way, “You are what you eat!” Therefore, the Eucharist is the food by which Jesus becomes alive in us. Transformed by Christ’s true Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, we receive the grace and power to go on mission as His disciple-maker.

Jesus comes to us in the Eucharist because this is His way of wanting to be in communion with you. The Eucharist is the spiritual food that sustains us and the Sacrament by which Jesus empowers us to help Him build up His Body, the Church. Let us never be shy about witnessing faith in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, once truly nourished by the Eucharist, we come to together in community, living out our individual vocations united in this single calling: making disciples for the salvation of souls. We do this in communion with our families, parishes, religious communities, schools, organizations, and all Catholic institutions.

If you already cherish the Eucharist, let your love for it shine brightly. Share it, adore it, and receive it with a joyful heart. If the Eucharist has not become a central part of your spiritual journey, I strongly invite you to make it a priority. Ask the Lord to kindle within you a deeper longing for His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, and experience the transformative grace it brings into your life.

St. Vincent de Paul Joliet Diocesan Council Announces Closure of Addison and Morris Thrift Stores

JOLIET, IL — The Society of St. Vincent de Paul Joliet Diocesan Council announced that it will close its two remaining thrift store locations in Addison and Morris effective **June 30, 2026**. The decision follows a unanimous vote of the Council, with one abstention, after several years of financial losses and extensive consultation with local parish Conferences. Rooted in its mission as “a network of friends, inspired by Gospel values, growing in holiness and building a more just world through personal relationships with and service to people in need,” the Council affirmed that the decision allows the organization to focus more directly on neighbor-to-neighbor assistance through parish-based Conferences. **Discontinuation of Clothing Drives and Drop Boxes** With the closure of the stores, all Council-directed clothing drives and drop boxes will be discontinued immediately. Clothing drives have historically supplied store inventory, but without retail operations they are no longer needed. Donations will continue to be accepted at the Addison and Morris locations through the spring of 2026. After that time, donations of clothing, furniture, and household goods will not be accepted. Drop boxes located on Parish grounds will be removed and recycled or sold.

Impact on Programs

The Basic Needs and Furniture Purchase Programs connected to the stores will end on June 30, 2026. However, the Council emphasized that essential charitable services will continue through local Conferences, including:

- Operation of food pantries and holiday meal and gift programs
- Assistance with rent and utility payments
- Distribution of grocery gift cards
- Help with car repairs
- Parish-based “clothes closets” and other local ministries

Commitment to the Future

The Council remains committed to expanding Conferences in underserved areas of the Joliet Diocese and strengthening the spiritual and charitable works of existing Conferences.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul thanks their dedicated employees, volunteers, donors, and community partners for their faithful support and invites continued generosity as it enters this new chapter of service.
