Easter Sunday is only 2 weeks away. I pray that your time of preparation is going well. Lent is a good time to deepen your prayer life with the Lord. Lent is also a time for reconciliation; something that helps us in our relationship with Christ. Next Sunday, Palm Sunday afternoon, I will be in the church near the statue of St. Joseph to hear confessions from 3:00-5:00. Feel free to stop in any time. There may be no one in front of you for confession or there might be 4-5 people in front of you. Also, if you would like the Anointing of the Sick, I will have the holy oil with me to give you that sacrament as well—just ask.

This week I will be away on retreat in southern Indiana at St. Meinrad. I started out my seminary years down there from January of 1984-May of 1986. St. Meinrad is a Benedictine Archabbey that has been running a seminary for many years. The college, of which I attended, closed in the early 90's. The school of theology currently has 120 seminarians. About 65 monks live in the abbey. I will keep you in my daily prayer while on retreat, and will also use the prayer intentions/requests that you have placed in my Prayer Bag.

LENTEN DISCIPLINES OF FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.
