From the Pastor's desk....

Holy Week is here. Our time of Lent is going to end soon. Today we take our palm leaf home to be placed in our home as a reminder of the passion of Jesus. His suffering and death brings us new life, healing and hope.

Monday afternoon all the priests of the diocese will gather at our great Cathedral with Bishop Hicks for the Chrism Mass or Mass of the Oils. These 3 holy oils will be blessed and brought into parish churches on Holy Thursday, and will be used for the sacraments throughout the coming year. Again, we are reminded of God's presence among us.

Holy Thursday comes with the reminder that we are to "wash one another's feet" as Jesus did, and we empty the tabernacle in anticipation of remembering the cross on Good Friday. Both Thursday and Friday services here will take place at 6:00 in the evening. I encourage you to come for these prayerful services.

When we gather to celebrate Eucharist next weekend, it will be Easter Joy. Holy Saturday will begin with the Easter Fire outdoors, and our lengthy Easter Vigil will begin. Saturday we start again at 6:00. Easter Sunday morning we return to our regular Sunday schedule of 8:00, 10:00 and noon. Come and experience the love of Christ through his suffering, death and resurrection.

**LENTEN DISCIPLINES OF
FASTING & ABSTINENCE**

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.
