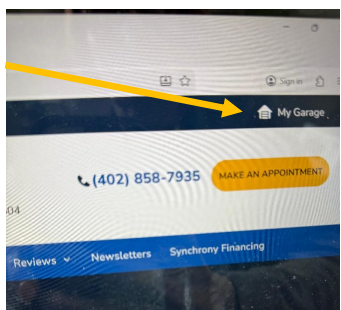

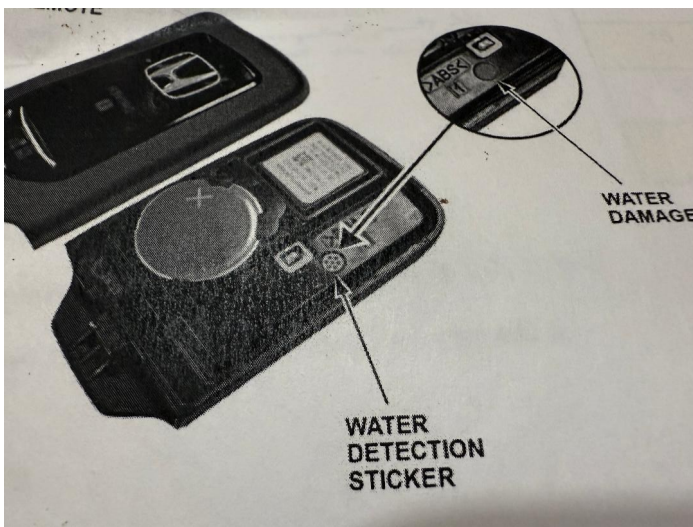

Oh, Oh, It's Not the Battery

I found this in Oct 2012 Honda Service News

Keyless operation fobs are designed to be water *resistant*, not *waterproof*. Don't take them into the pool when swimming your morning laps.

Some fobs have a little sticker inside that will be white with dots. That means you're good. If you see a reddish or pink dot, that means you may be sunk. If the fob doesn't work, it's probably not the battery.



\$50 says we can make your headlights work better.

We can polish a lot of headlights so they are dramatically better. The top light is so glazed over, it is dangerous to drive with it.

Is this permanent? No, but it's a great improvement. You might be able to hand polish them after this to keep them clear. No charge if we can't do it.



Car Quiz

1. T or F—If you're on a trip and the amber "Check Engine" light comes on, you don't need to pull over.
2. T or F—If you're driving and a whole bunch of warning lights come on, the first thing to do is check the engine oil level. The sooner, the better.
3. T or F—Front wheel drive vehicles are easier to control on snow and ice than All Wheel Drive.
4. T or F—If your car takes regular gas, occasionally fill up with premium (91 octane) to give it a treat.

Answers to Quiz

1. True. There may be over 10,000 combinations of things that will trip that light. It will flash if it's urgent. As long as the vehicle performs well, it can wait.
2. True. This is a fairly recent issue. New engines have a lot of fluid valves that activate things. Operated by oil under pressure, they stop working when the oil level gets too low. This will be your only warning system for low oil level that is forgiving. The red oil pressure light is too late to act most times.
3. True. In ice and snow, all wheel drive vehicles do one thing very well and that is accelerate in a straight line. All 4 wheels are linked to the engine and each other. On ice, they can't stop or turn as well as a front wheel drive. They are each fighting for traction. This is why most vehicles in the ditch during a snow event are all wheel drive.
4. False. Your car ain't a dog. The octane rating depends on engine build. Use what the manual says.
