From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

"They have no wine."

These simple words uttered by the Blessed Mother put into motion a flurry of angst and action. In response to her simple plea, Jesus performed the first of His miracles at a wedding in Cana inviting His disciples to begin to put their faith in Him and believe.



Wine has always had such a special place in our human existence for as long as it has been a part of our world. Cultivated and fermented by the ancients more than six millennia before Christ, wine was seen as the crowning of human effort blessed by God. It is difficult to make good wine! It takes a vineyard in just the right location and within a suitable climate. It takes many years of cultivating and pruning the vines, giving them just the right amount of moisture and fertilizer, care and attention. When the grapes are finally ripe, it takes a whole community to go out and harvest them all at once. Leave the grapes on the vine too long and you get raisins! And then, they must be crushed all at once, filtered, and placed in wine skins or bottles for the all-important fermentation. Then, proper aging perfects the wine and finally, it is ready to be drunk. A good vintage means that all of these elements have come together to produce a tasty and drinkable wine that will bring joy to the heart and warmth to the soul. And since God controls the rain and the sunshine, and it is God's good earth that the vines grow in, the Lord is seen as having a heavy hand in how good the wine is and how much is produced each year. A great vintage means that God is blessing the community richly!

It is no secret, then, that wine played a central part in Jewish life, especially at a wedding. The cup of blessing is a potent and powerful sign of God's blessing on the young couple that comes together in marriage. If it were to run out or be of some inferior quality, it clearly could be a sign that the union will not last or that the Lord will not bless the couple in the years to come.

Thus Mary's concern for this unnamed couple, and Jesus' tender response to her appeal. For those of you who are *Chosen* fans, there is a wonderful portrayal of Mary's gentle "Please?" to Jesus to do "something." Nothing like a mother's gut-wrenching, oh-so-subtle plea to rend the heart of even the most hardened of sons. That her son is the Son of God, doesn't hurt!

Jesus' response is to turn water into wine—an overabundance of wine, and the good stuff at that! Apart from God flexing His considerable wine-making skills, the abundance and quality of the wine are a sign itself of the overwhelming blessings that are yet to come in the Kingdom of God. When God blesses, God blesses in abundance! When God creates, God creates the very best! When God accompanies, God does so with strength and protection! Thus marriage itself as an institution, when God is invited into its midst, becomes the source of an enormous blessing not only for this one lucky couple in ancient Cana, but for all who are wise enough to welcome

the Lord into their married life.

Jesus' presence in this wedding at Cana didn't prevent the wine from running out, but did present a powerful remedy when there was a cause for anxiety and dread. Jesus' presence in our lives will not prevent us going through times of want or traversing rough and rocky roads or monstrous waves at sea. But when we invite His presence into our midst, He will find a way through the rough patches and will show us how to trust in His love through towering seas and dark valleys. Jesus never promised that we wouldn't suffer in this world, but rather that we could suffer with confidence that His love has conquered all, and that the blessings that God wants to lavish on us will be ours in abundance.

Sometimes, we just get stuck between: "The wine has run out" and "You have saved the best for last!" It is here that Mary must become our model of discipleship and pattern of holiness. Her simple words, "Do whatever He tells you," bely an enormous and profound trust in the Lord who can do anything for us, will always be faithful, and earnestly wants to bless us generously. Remembering our call to faithfulness, even if we haven't yet seen how God will bless us, we must act as if He already has. The Letter to the Hebrews reminds us, "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen." (Hb 11:1) This means that our active hoping in the Lord allows us to perceive the many ways that God is already blessing and caring for us. For it is with the eyes of faith that we are called to navigate this world, a faith that leads us forward on paths unknown to a sinful and darkened world.

So . . . running a little low in the "fruit of the vine" department? Focusing on doing what God would ask of us will lead to a profusion of life and joy if we are faithful to living out our trust in Him.


Shawls and Lapghans




