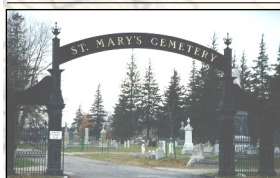

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Have you ever met someone with a "short fuse," you know, someone who doesn't need much of an excuse to launch a full-scale verbal offensive or more at you or the nearest human target without reason? Sometimes we refer to such an individual as having a "chip on their shoulder" or maybe "carries a grudge" against someone or something. Admittedly, they can be hard to be around for any length of time. From painful past experience, many of us when faced with this scenario often find ourselves tiptoeing around in a conversation, trying to steer clear of any hot-button issues or known triggers, lest we find ourselves deluged into an unwelcome 45-minute tirade. There are some angry, hot-headed individuals out there who are ready to rumble at a moment's notice. Encountering them on occasion can be uncomfortable and awkward.



Now, imagine an entire society filled with such personalities! It is said that Jesus lived in what is called an "agonistic" culture, where conflict and riposte were just under the skin and even the most benign of conversations could erupt into full-scale violence if the wrong words were spoken. Hot-blooded and passionate might be understatement as words to describe His countrymen. This was well known by Jesus, of course. And it is no wonder that in this weekend's Gospel that He sought to dispel the possibility of violence and de-escalate the most serious of conflict by steering people away from questionable behaviors that could and would lead to even more serious offenses.

For example, though killing is bad and always to be avoided lest violence beget violence in reprisal, name-calling and belittling of others can be just the spark that leads to something worse. While divorce was technically allowed in His time and place, Jesus cautions against such behavior for frivolous reasons because He knew it would rip families apart, spur violence within what were very tight-knit villages, and oppress women who would often bear the brunt of the consequences. Adultery and unfaithfulness were egregious actions that often caused violent retribution from perceived dishonor among aggrieved family members. Jesus here warns us to avoid even lustful thoughts, which are always the precursor to future illicit actions. He even challenges people to stay away from making false or grandiose oaths and proclamations, which could easily be misunderstood. Just say "yes, when you mean yes," and "no, when you mean no," He counsels. He might say, "For Heaven's sake, watch your mouth!"

In all this, Jesus is attempting to move people away from behaviors, actions, and vices that not only are bad in and of themselves, but also have the strong tendency to lead to something worse. Given the very high likelihood of these various sins leading to violence, it is best to just avoid all of it altogether. In other words, put a fence around that which must never be violated, so that the worst may not occur.

AED and First Aid Kits

You may have noticed that the AEDs or Automated External Defibrillators kits, "stop-bleed" kits, and updated first-aid kits have been installed in all of our worship spaces and parish halls.

The cost for these complete kits (AED, stop-bleed, and first aid) with their respective cabinets and required supplies is \$1,768.00 each. To date we have received \$5,900 in donations to help pay for the purchase of these life-saving kits and we have received a commitment for an additional \$1,800.00.

We will still need \$6,500.00. We invite parishioners who are able to consider making a donation to help pay for these potentially life-saving kits. Full or partial donations for these sets are welcome and appreciated for both parishes.

Additionally, we have multiple offers from parishioners who are familiar with how to use these devices to do an informal training after weekend Masses. Plus, we hope to also offer certification in CPR and basic first aid for anyone who might be interested in going through the training. Stay tuned for more information about where and when. Today, we might call some of these "near occasions of sin." If the sin is violent head-bashing, then avoiding harsh words and violence-inducing speech is the fence surrounding it we must respect, lest all hell break loose... and so on and so forth.

It gives us today reason to pause and consider our own actions. Although we live in a much calmer society than the Lord did (unless one brings up religion or politics), our own use of freedoms and rights can be careless and reckless if it incites hatred, prejudice, and violence. As the author to the Letter to the Ephesians once wrote, "Let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth, but only such a word as is good for edification according to the need of the moment, so that it will give grace to those who hear." (Eph 4:29) And, in our inner motives, we must be careful not to venture down what can quickly become a slippery slope, far from God's Grace.

Next week, we begin our annual journey through the Season of Lent with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. It is a sobering moment when we recall our own mortality and the ultimate consequences of sin which leads to death. Yet it is also not without the hope that Christ came to give and the ever-present call to repentance and reform. This begins with an honest assessment before God of our failures, all the while clinging to God's gracious offer of mercy through Christ. Short fuse or not, it is good to take note not only of our sins, but that which may lead us into sin.

And with God's help, avoid it all.

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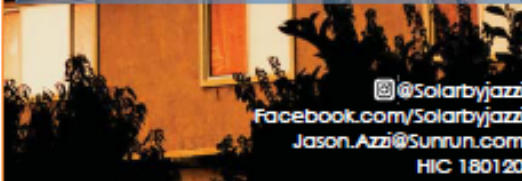
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
