From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Nearly ten years ago, while on pilgrimage in the Holy Land, I fell in love with pomegranates. Practically everywhere we went, there were roadside vendors who would crush the bright pinkish-red fruit into the most delightful and refreshing juice. Given that the daily temperature reached into the 90's for most of our trip, the sweet, cool, fragrant juice was a welcome treat.



Upon return to the U.S., however, trying to enjoy this healthy now-addiction was more of a challenge. Purchasing the whole fruit in the supermarket was easy enough when they were in season. However, trying to extract the fruit and not get covered by squished juice or stained by crushed seeds is a challenge! Opened on a kitchen counter, they run everywhere! Recently, however, I found a great tip (or "hack" as it is sometimes called) on the Internet that directs one to first slice off the top of the pomegranate, then using a pairing knife, slice it along the subtle octagonal ridges that follow the fruit from top to bottom. Then, submerge the fruit in a big, deep bowl of water to easily peel the fruit apart and gently rub the seeds away from the chaff of the inner webbing. The fruited seeds will sink to the bottom of the bowl, while the paper-like chaff will float on the surface, where it can be strained away. Drain the water and, Voilà! Fresh pomegranate to be enjoyed! This quick and simple method will separate the precious seeds from the husk, purifying the edible from the inedible.

Purifying. It all sounds so simple—take the good from among the bad, keeping the good, discarding the bad. That may work all well and fine for a piece of fruit, but when it comes to sin and grace, things can get quite intertwined and sometimes vague. Writing more than five centuries before the time of Jesus, the prophet Malachi envisioned One who would cleanse and purify as none had before:

And suddenly there will come to the temple the LORD whom you seek. . . . For he is like the refiner's fire, or like the fuller's lye. He will sit refining and purifying silver, and he will purify the sons of Levi, Refining them like gold or like silver that they may offer due sacrifice to the LORD. (Mal 3:2-3)

Here, we are not talking about separating a few seeds from the chaff, but of industrial-level smelting using extreme heat and pressure to extract the good from among those who are surrounded by evil. Echoed in Handel's Messiah many centuries later, these passages have stirred the hearts of many to anticipate and look forward to the coming of the Lord in time. As Isaiah would proclaim:

On that day it will be said: "Indeed, this is our God; we looked to him, and he saved us! This is the LORD to whom we looked; let us rejoice and be glad that he has saved us!" (Is 25:9)

In ancient Judaism, purity was an important aspect of one's devotion to the Lord. Today, we think of it as an inner disposition, a moral quality of the heart, a steadfast

innocence, if you will. But the ancients thought of it also as something physical. It was important to the people of long ago to maintain the complete or intact outer skin of the body, as a way of keeping the profane (that which is outside) away from that which is sacred (the interior.) This was seen to apply to any break of the skin where blood might flow and of any childbirth, which certainly can be a messy, fleshy affair. In these cases, a ritual purification was performed to wash away the blood and celebrate the restoration of wholeness. Thus in this context, Mary and Joseph brought the baby Jesus to the Temple to complete their ritual purifications according to the Law, and to offer Jesus in consecration to the Lord, a sacred first-fruit, whose life would be seen to belong to God from his earliest moments. The Book of Leviticus directs that this would take place 40 days after the birth of a male child, hence our celebration of it on this date.

Luke has memorialized this encounter in what we might call a prophetic pericope, containing the prophesy of Simeon and also that of Anna, as a foreshadowing of what is to come through Christ. Prayed as part of the Church's formal Night Prayer every evening, Simeon's words are often among the last many faithful clergy and laity alike hear before they close their eyes and go to sleep:

Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel. (Lk 2:29-32)

This feast is reminder to us of God's power to save, to refine, to purify, to cleanse, to renew, to restore, to reinvent, to reinvigorate and completely transform our troubled world. His plan of salvation is thorough, exhaustive and lacking in nothing. In Christ, we see our hope and its fulfillment beautifully arrayed like the most precious jewel, the finest of gold or silver, the most aromatic of spices and the purest of wine. In Christ, superlatives and human language all fall short, and what is left is mystery, the fullness of God's love for us all. May we rejoice always in the great gift of God that is Jesus Christ.

IC Haiti Update Report

February 2015—Part 1

This first part of a two-part update regarding IC Haiti's mission to the rural school community of Puit Chacha will provide context for the importance of our assistance there.

Puit Chacha is in the central part of the southern peninsula of Haiti. It is approximately 75 miles from the beleaguered capital Port-au-Prince where gang violence continues unabated and its dire effects are felt throughout the nation in the form of widespread food shortages, rising prices for essential goods and fuel, unprecedented social upheaval, and ongoing disruptions in transportation, travel, and trade.

A recent Boston Globe article "School is an impossible dream for the children of Haiti" by Frances Robles of the New York Times (January 26, 2025) described the disruptive and chilling effects that gang violence is having upon Haiti's school children. Homes and entire neighborhoods in and around Port-au-Prince have been abandoned, and thousands of families have sought shelter in overcrowded former school and government buildings or in areas far beyond the capital. It is estimated that three hundred thousand children are no longer attending schools around Haiti; and with so many families homeless, hungry, and out of work, children are being recruited by the gangs. A mother of four whose shop and home were destroyed by gangs was quoted by Robles as saying that it's almost impossible to make school a priority when the main priority for all parents in Haiti right now is how to survive. The Robles article offers a more detailed account of this aspect of the ongoing crisis in Haiti.

As we recently reported in the December 2024 bulletins, IC Haiti's mission to support the school community in Puit Chacha and the medical facility in Fond des Blancs continues despite Haiti's ongoing crisis. The Fr. Marc Piché elementary school offers school age children a stable educational environment along with a hot lunch program daily. IC Haiti also provides tuition for those students who continue a secondary school education in nearby Fond des Blancs. And our partners at the St. Boniface Hospital carry on 24 hours a day, seven days a week, providing critical medical care to all in need.

In part two of this update, we will share with you a more detailed report on how the Fr. Marc Piché elementary school and the schoolchildren are doing this school year.




