Jubilee 2025: Opening The Holy Doors

Jesus said, "I am the door." John 10:7



On December 24, 2024, Pope Francis opened the Holy Door, "Porta Sacra," at St. Peter's Basilica, signaling the opening of Jubilee 2025, the Holy Year of Pilgrims of Hope.

The doors' 16 bronze panels tell the story of salvation from the

Garden of Eden to the Resurrection and are opened every 25 years to celebrate the anniversary of the incarnation of Christ.

During the Holy Year, faithful are encouraged to make a pilgrimage to the site of the Holy Door and pass through, leaving the world behind and entering into the presence of the Lord. Symbolically, we abandon lives of sin and temptation as the open doors offer a removal of barriers to a deeper encounter with Christ.

In Rome, several other doors have been designated as pilgrimage sites including St. John the Lateran, St. Paul Outside the Wall, and St. Mary Major. Over 30 million pilgrims are expected to visit Rome during this Holy Year.

The Vatican has also designated "holy doors" or pilgrimage sites throughout the world encouraging visits to focus on prayer, forgiveness and acts of mercy. In Massachusetts, pilgrimage sites include the Cathedral of the Holy Cross, St. Clement, and Most Holy Redeemer in Boston along with Holy Rosary in Lawrence, St. Joseph the Worker in Lowell and Divine Mercy in Salem serving the North Shore. Visits to these sites encourage reconciliation, conversion, and spiritual renewal.

At the end of the Jubilee on Epiphany 2026, the Pope is the last person to walk through the door before he closes it. The door is then bricked up and, once again sealed on the inside until 2050.

May this Year of Hope allow for an opening of our hearts to change as we reflect on God's work and our calling to be His hands and feet.

"This is the door of the Lord where the just may enter." (Psalm 118:20)


Immaculate Conception SVdP now offers a St. Vincent de Paul clothing drop box. We are accepting **clothing and shoes only** in the drop box.

Centering Prayer for Lent

Lent is a time to follow Jesus more closely and learn from him how to pray in silence, spending time placing God at the center of your life, opening yourself to a loving Father, surrendering your will and in trust allowing God to transform you. This interior prayer is how we pray as we Center.

Centering Prayer is an ancient Christian practice available to all who seek transformation through a more intimate relationship with God. This daily practice deepens our faith as we come to better know our God as one who loves us unconditionally just as we are and trust God has plans to give us a future of hope. Centering Prayer helps us say to the Father, "Not my will but yours be done" (Lk. 22: 42).

Please consider joining us and let God move you closer to him. All are welcome as we gather Wednesday evenings from 6:00–7:00 p.m. via Zoom. Following 30 minutes of Centering Prayer, we practice Lectio Divina. We listen to God's words in scripture, ponder, and share what we hear the Lord saying to us here and now and contemplate for the following week God's message to us and let it guide our choices and actions. Both practices strengthen our faith and reliance on God and deepen and our personal relationship with God.

Lent begins March 5

Directed Lenten Retreat

Lent: A Time of Choice, Challenge and Change,
*Exploring the cost of becoming Jesus' disciple
 by carrying your cross each day.*

If anyone wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross daily and follow me. For whoever wishes to finds his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. (Lk. 9:23–24)

This retreat will focus on the inner work of Lent signified by the outward sign of ashes. It will provide a time and space to engage in interior work to support and explore your public proclamation and respond to Jesus' call. Lent is a time of choice, challenge and change. In Luke we hear Jesus invite us to follow him if we are willing to pay the cost of discipleship and be changed. What concretely, does Jesus mean by this?

Ron Rolheiser, OMI responds to this question with insights gathered from James Martin's book, *Jesus: A Pilgrimage*, namely taking up your cross daily and giving up your life in order to find a deeper life in Christ means six interpenetrating things that we will explore along with other questions. Why is suffering necessary and salvific? What supports you to change? How do you pray? What is hard to surrender? Where do you resist change? Do you believe in Jesus' promise? The season of Lent calls us to reflect on and explore such questions with faith.

I will provide material for reading and reflection from scripture and a variety of spiritual teachers that reflect your unique relationship with God as we explore these and other questions you may have. We will meet for four in-person or Zoom spiritual direction sessions you schedule throughout retreat. As we open ourselves to the Holy Spirit's wisdom, I will listen deeply as you share and together, we allow the Holy Spirit to move us and bless and guide our sharing. This offering is designed to provide an affordable, convenient retreat that creates an intimate space for you to share yourself deeply with the Holy Spirit's guidance.


