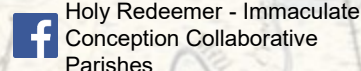
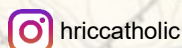
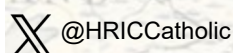

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Have you ever heard of the term, "guilty pleasure?" You know what I mean—one of those little things that we indulge in every once in a while that isn't really all that bad, but we might not want to publicly advertise as a habit? For me, one of those things are Slim Jims. Ever since I was a kid, I have enjoyed the salty, tangy little beef jerky-like mini sausages as a quick snack. Whenever I feel a greater temptation towards that jar of cookies, the leftover piece of pie that is screaming at me from the fridge or one of those ubiquitous "hot cross buns" that seem to self-replicate during Lent, I reach for one of these little babies! I know that *they* are not good for me, but heh, they are low in carbs, if any other nutritional value. And they taste good! So there.

Of course, when did I last give in to my guilty pleasure? You guessed it! The first Friday of Lent. No sooner had I finished munching down one of these delightful little puppies and before the wrapper had even settled into the trash bin, I realized what I had done. Lent was not even a few days old, and already, I had broken the abstinence rule! Now, as an adult Catholic, I know that the bishops of our Church over the years have acknowledged the freedom each of us has to follow our conscience when it comes to the laws of fasting and abstinence during Lent. However, "no Catholic Christian should lightly excuse him/herself from so hallowed a tradition." Extra penance for me, I guess! I can do better.

Fortunately, that is precisely what the Season of Lent is for: doing better. Our call to fasting and abstinence has multiple purposes. First, as a matter of discipline, it actively engages our human will to control our desires better, lest they go unchecked and follow their own designs without any external reference. Lent is a time to reign in our wants and desires for the purpose of building some "muscle memory" in our souls to embracing the inner discipline necessary to follow Christ. Because it won't always be intuitive or in sync with our feelings and likes at a given moment. Sometimes we need to tell ourselves, "no," and follow another, better path. If we cannot curb our appetites in small ways during this limited penitential time, how will we make greater sacrifices at other times in our lives when they are absolutely necessary?

A second purpose to our Lenten fasting and abstinence is to help us be closer to the poor and needy of this world. As a matter of true honesty, we live in a wealthy community in the midst of one of the most wealthy nations on earth. Our land and country have been enormously blessed with unprecedented access to food, clothing, and all of the material goods that define great abundance. And even when these are sometimes a struggle for individuals or in short supply, it is a "first-world" struggle as compared to enduring a war zone or the desert of famine and pestilence that millions and millions of our brothers and sisters suffer with every day, trying to cling to life. Think of the people in Gaza, those on the front lines in Ukraine or anywhere in Haiti, just to name a few. Thus, our Lenten sacrifices are meant, at least in some small way, to help us be more aware of their wants and less focused on our own. In centuries past, only the very rich could afford meat, so the Lenten abstinence from meat was

really aimed at the very few who needed to become closer to the vast throngs of the poor, whose daily sustenance (when it was available) was bread and fish. Giving up that T-bone steak one day a week until Easter hardly seems like asking too much, eh?

Another great purpose of our Lenten sacrifices, and certainly not the least, is to bring our own moments of intentional diminishment and make them one with the self-emptying of Christ. From the Letter of Paul to the Philippians, we read: "Have among yourselves the same attitude that is also yours in Christ Jesus, Who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross." (Phil 2:5-8). As Jesus disciplined Himself for 40 days and nights in the desert, so, too, we embrace this time of Lent and the sacrifices that go with it as a way to make our small efforts one with His great and enduring example of perfect obedience to the Father. We take on a small yoke that we might begin to familiarize ourselves better with the unrelenting task that He embraced on our behalf in offering His entire life for us so that we might live. His triumph over temptation, sin, and death becomes our victory in His resurrection. We want to be a part of this! *We need to be a part of this! We have no hope or life unless we are a part of this! Therefore, our Lenten observances help open our hearts to more fully embrace the true gift that is made to us of Christ.*

So, back to guilty pleasures and the sacrifices of Lent. Not that I want to encourage anyone to carelessly break the rules for fasting and abstinence, but as your pastor, I am very concerned that whatever we do for Lent, collectively and individually, makes sense in light of everything that is at stake. While we are called to abstain from all meat on Fridays during Lent (and on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday), indulging in Lobster Thermador or the most expensive seafood dish on the menu moves us, obviously, very far away from being one with the poor. Better that we munch down a few chicken wings and call it a day, than spend 10 times that on something that technically fulfills the law, but is absent any whispering of its spirit. To make it even more intentional, it's not simply a matter of us doing without, but taking the value of that which we have sacrificed and offering it in some way to those who are in need. Maybe a little math is required here. How much do I actually spend on the frivolities of life? What is the average cost of a meal? How much would I save if, for example, if I embraced a humble bowl of ramen on every Friday during Lent instead of that super-sized Big Mac and fries? Might I take that money saved and donate it to the St. Vincent de Paul Society, to Catholic Charities, IC Haiti, the HR Sandwich Program or the Pelican Fund? Might I take the money saved by devoting an evening during Lent praying the Stations of the Cross and enjoying the simple supper offered before or after (check the bulletin!) and putting it towards the purchase of items for the Care Packs for the Homeless or the ongoing weekly collection of toiletries, non-perishables, and paper goods in the back of each church foyer? Maybe it's not even about money, but the sacrifice of my time and presence that could then be redirected and offered to someone who needs help with household chores, grocery shopping, or maybe just a

little human contact and conversation. We've all heard the saying, "nature abhors a vacuum." Well, God, through our constant prayer, will help fill any void that we might create in penance and love.

So, go ahead and indulge in those little guilty pleasures if you must. But first, let us offer our hearts to the Lord more fervently through this time of Lent, that whatever we give up, or whatever we take on may lead us into deeper solidarity with the poor, give us greater strength to follow the Lord when the going gets tougher and most of all, bring us into a fuller Communion with the God who loves and saves. After all, we don't have to stop being good or making sacrifices once Easter arrives if they have brought us closer to the mystery of who Christ is. Lent might just be the beginning of many (better) things to come....

Guidelines for Lent

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. See our website's Lent 2024 page for more Lent inspiration: hriccatholic.org.

Fasting during Lent

Good Friday is a day of fasting. Catholics age 18–59 are bound to the obligation of fasting. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including water, milk, and fruit juices are allowed.

Abstinence during Lent

Abstinence is observed on *all* Fridays of Lent. Abstinence is the absence of meat all day. Fish is allowed, though. All Catholics over 14 years bound to the obligation of abstinence.

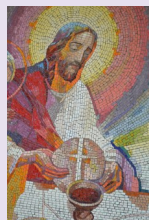

The Nutting House Becomes the New School

175th Anniversary History Continued

Rev. McManmon was faced with a need to provide new quarters for the parochial school as soon as he became Pastor. The original school building had served its purpose for 47 years but was judged unsafe for further use by 1929. Rev. McManmon was now able to turn to a property that had been acquired by Fr. Ryan in 1919: The Nutting House.

The Nutting House is located at the corner of Green and Washington Streets. The brick structure was built in 1782 as the home of clockmaker, Jonathan Milliken. Over time, it passed through several families and in the early 1900's became the property of Wallace Nutting. Nutting was a noted photographer and colorist who purchased five colonial era homes in New England for the purpose of capturing the history of American architecture and furnishings. In 1919 it was auctioned off to Jere W. Doyle and then ultimately became the property of the parish.



Turning the house into a school took only six months. On August 25, 1930, the building was opened for inspection. Two weeks later some 400 students began the school year. In a few weeks we will share the next chapter in the Nutting House saga.

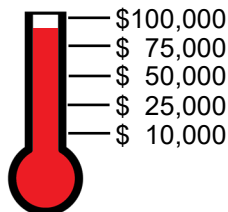
