





## From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

As we enter wholeheartedly this week into our Lenten season, I think it is important to remember the goal of everything we do during this holy time of the year: to prepare to renew our Baptismal Promises.



Wait, what about prayer, fasting, almsgiving, abstinence, sacrifice, confession, ashes... and more, aren't these all supposed to be a central part of Lent?

Well, yes and no.

Yes, to the extent that doing any of these things or embracing any time-honored discipline helps hone our relationship with God and better prepare us to renew our Baptismal commitment to Him at Easter. But, no, if any of these things are done for the wrong reason, to bring glory to ourselves and fail to draw us closer to God. As we heard on Wednesday, even generous almsgiving loses its salvific nature when done in public and with great fanfare. "When you give alms, do not blow a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets to win the praise of others. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward." (Mt. 6:2) To be helpful to our salvation, discretion and humility are required right alongside generosity and sacrifice. Give, so that you may have a greater understanding of God's love for those in need, and THAT will help you be ready to renew your Baptismal Promises at Easter.

Over the years, many of us have had it beaten into us that we must "give up something for Lent." Chocolate, screen time, desserts, booze, and excessive frivolity with our friends were often on the top of the list, No?! If you weren't sacrificing something that you really liked or wanted, well, you were a terrible sinner and getting worse by the day. Lent became a tortuous exercise of beating our will into submission, almost to the point of taking pride in how miserable one could become. But did that really help us renew our Baptismal call to holiness?

Baptism wipes away sin. It frees us from the bondage of sin and death and gives the bright promise of eternal life. Baptism is about rejecting evil, the Devil and "all of his empty show." Whenever Christ encountered the demonic, He silenced it, would not let it speak and cast it away. Our approach to the rigors of Lent must engage this same practice: do not give overt attention to temptation, to sin or its proponents. Rather, give it no voice, no place to fester and grow. In the name of the Lord Jesus, cast it out and away. Rebuke it solidly in our faith, that it may have no mastery over us. As Jesus once told His disciples, "Do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven." (Lk. 10:20)

Then, let's get to the all-important business of strengthening and deepening our belief in the God who has revealed Himself to be Father, Son, and Spirit, and the Church He founded. This is where prayer can be so fruitful—joyful praise that lifts our souls to the ecstasy of Heaven. No mournful dirge here! When we talk to the Lord, who has given us all things in Christ, our hearts must be filled with delight and awe. Prayer must be from the depths of our spirit—maybe

even without words, lifting our souls to reach out to the divine. Prayer can be simple and quick or lengthy and thorough. But it must be honest and real and without pretense, remembering that God already knows what we are praying for even before we ask. Prayer must ponder the ineffable, while taking delight in the mundane. When at Easter we say that we believe in God, has our Lenten prayerfulness furthered our understanding of who the Lord is, that we might love Him with greater fervor?

When we fast, we must not treat it as some divine-inspired diet...you know, to lose a few of those pounds that our doctor keeps bringing up. No, fasting must be happy and purposeful. We let go of something good, to make a hole and make room for God to fill that space with something better. We embrace silence so as to better hear the voice of God speaking to us. We open our routine and daily schedule that God may arrange things differently, and for a purpose. Fasting can be done by forgoing the dreary and selfish to embrace the life and festivity of the other...to better encounter God in service to another. At Easter, will we be more-full of God's love, and less of hatred, despair, and neglect?

Almsgiving is about sharing. Or, rather, about taking delight in other's benefitting from the gifts that God has first lent to us. It might be about money. It might be about offering our gifts and talents to others who are struggling. It might be about donating our time or attention to those whom other's give none at all. Our simple presence, lavishly given, is redemptive and life-giving. It might be about resolving to spend this Lenten period more "in the moment." And there we will encounter the God who never leaves that singular moment of love for us and our world. At Easter, through what we have given, how much more have we received?

And what of our relationship to the Church? While the human face of the institution will always be in need of reform, Church is about so much more than a body of rules and proscriptions. It is a mystical Body of believers, with Christ as our head. It is the holy People of God, redeemed and cleansed. It is partially seen now, yet its fullness is yet to be revealed. It is already, but not yet. It is the hope of all the earth, and the fulfillment that can only be found in Heaven. There is great strength in united prayer and faith. This Easter, through our Lenten journey, will our relationship with the Church be stronger, more vibrant and deeply sincere?

Using the lens of our Baptismal Promises to guide our choices and efforts in these next six weeks will better enable us to embrace Christ: crucified, buried and risen. May this be happy and holy time of the year for us all!

## Evensong

*St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Nbpt., March 9, 5:00 p.m.*

Evensong is an ancient tradition of music, Scripture, and prayer, oftentimes referred to as Vespers or Evening prayer. It is typically celebrated in the Anglican Church prior to Nighttime prayer or Compline. Similar forms of song and prayer are observed daily in monastic life.

On March 9, at 5:00 p.m., St. Paul's Episcopal Church and its Jubilate Choir will share sung psalms and canticles interspersed with Scripture readings and prayer. All are welcome to join in this beautiful act of praising God, reflecting on His word and preparing for a peaceful sleep.

## Guidelines for Lent

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent.

## Fasting during Lent


Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting. Catholics age 18–59 are bound to the obligation of fasting. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including water, milk, and fruit juices are allowed.

## Abstinence during Lent

Abstinence is observed on *all* Fridays of Lent. Abstinence is the absence of meat all day. Fish is allowed during Lent, though. All Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence.

## Lenten 5-Week Rosary Challenge

### The First Sorrowful Mystery: The Agony In the Garden

#### Spiritual Fruit: God's Will Be Done

Together with His disciples, Jesus goes to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray to His Heavenly Father. Although accompanied by His followers and friends, Jesus feels utterly alone as He contemplates the mission He is soon to complete. Although fully submissive and dedicated to His Father's will, Jesus allows His humanity to feel the immense horror and pain that His sacrifice will entail. Jesus sees the sins of all mankind, whose guilt He will take upon Himself.



This mystery teaches us that in times of darkness and anguish, God is present to give us strength against the temptation towards weakness. We are comforted by our trust that God's Mercy and Justice will prevail. (Source: Rosary.com)




