Dear Parishioners,

On Easter Monday, we woke to the sad news that the Lord has called our brother, Pope Francis, home to the heavenly kingdom. After celebrating the joy of Easter and making a surprise appearance in St. Peter's Square on Easter Sunday morning, the Holy Father passed to the Lord. Our Archbishop, Richard Henning shared these words with us:

*I was deeply saddened by the news of the passing of Pope Francis. His legacy as Holy Father is broad and deep. In his ministry and across his writings he has continuously called us to deeper faith and to a more generous participation in the boundless compassion of God. He has challenged us to turn away from selfish impulses and towards communion with others and respect for God's creation. I am personally grateful that he called me to the Episcopacy and entrusted me with the pastoral care of the Church of Boston. His example remains a guiding light to the Universal Church. Through the intercession of Our Blessed Mother and Saint Joseph, may he rest in peace."*

*"While it is a terrible loss I personally find comfort in the fact that the Holy Father passed during this beautiful time of the Octave when we give glory to God for the truth that Jesus is Risen. May our Holy Father be welcomed to that glory and may we find strength in that hope.*

## From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Would you do it? If the resurrected Jesus were standing right in front of you, offering the nail marks in His hands and baring the spear mark in His side, would you take Him up on His invitation to put your fingers and hand into His wounds as proof that He really did rise from the dead? Would you?



Although this may seem like a useless academic exercise as the Risen Lord is not standing right before us, and that this event seems to be a singular offer to St. Thomas and him alone...still the question haunts me. It's not that I stay awake at night pondering such a (gruesome?) possibility, but it is more a question of whether my faith is strong enough to believe without the physical proof. I guess that was the whole point in confronting Thomas and maybe addressing the scores of other early disciples who must have harbored the same doubts and questions. After all, asking anyone to believe that anybody rose from the dead is so far beyond the beyond that it certainly does merit a reasonable desire for some kind of proof.

Yet our faith is not about science. Rather it is about trust and hope and the fulfillment of a kind of love that cannot be contained by the boundaries of this world. Recall the disciples who were walking along the way on the Road to Emmaus. Having the Risen Jesus right there, engaging Him in conversation, talking with Him, sharing what must have been several hours with Him along the way...it was their hearts that first responded to the joy of His resurrection, long before their eyes would recognize Him. "Were not our hearts burning [within us] while he spoke to us on the way and opened the scriptures to us?" (Lk 24:32) Believing that Jesus rose from the dead is first a heart-response, long before it ever becomes something that makes sense cognitively. "Proof" takes on a whole new meaning, just as what constitutes genuine faith is redefined and understood in a whole new way.

Probably about the closest thing we have to actual scientific "proof" that Jesus rose from the dead is the Shroud of Turin—what is believed to be the actual burial cloth that covered Jesus' body in the tomb at the very moment of His resurrection. While some scientific studies years ago have cast questions about its authenticity, others more recently

have made great strides to overcome previous concerns and underscore the plausibility of its genuineness. If it is not the actual burial cloth of Jesus Christ, then it is the burial cloth of 30-something-old, first century male who was flogged, beaten, crucified, crowned with thorns, pierced in his side where blood and water flowed and wrapped head-to-foot in the traditional Jewish way for a man hastily buried after his death. The image on the cloth cannot be fully explained by modern science, but has been shown to be a photographic negative, a hologram, actually—three-dimensional in its qualities—a technique that would not become possible until nearly 20 centuries later. The source of light to make the image appears to be from an intense burst of radiation that came from within the body of the deceased itself. And yet all of this, along with other forensic evidence such as first century pollen grains embedded within the fabric of the Shroud, does not constitute conclusive proof of anything.

It still comes down to faith. "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." (Jn 20:29) In the end, we have no indication that St. Thomas ever took Jesus up on His offer, but we do have plenty of evidence that his faith was confirmed not only by his encounter with the Risen Lord, but also through the communal faith of the disciples who regularly witnessed to His resurrection and His enduring presence among them through the Breaking of the Bread. Thus, as for them and so now for us, we believe because we experience His present love—in the Breaking of the Bread, in those who are in need, in our neighbor, in those who hunger and thirst, in those who are sick, imprisoned or hospitalized...in those who hope, where hope ought not to exist. We believe because God endows us with that gift from on high.

So would you do it? Would you need to? Or is His enduring love, mercy and forgiveness enough?

## Newburyport Choral Society to Perform at IC

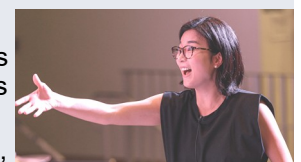
**Newburyport Choral Society 90th Anniversary Spring Concert—Jubilate!**
