ANGLERS AGAINST LITTER BACK ON THE BANK





ANGLING TRUST PUBLISHES **ANNUAL REPORT ON WATER QUALITY**



The Angling Trust has launched its first WQMN Report, which does not make for pleasant reading. No-one will be surprised to hear that the waters we fish are in crisis, with record levels of pollution present. Just click on the cover to review the report.

Our club, along with many others up and down the country, is leading the fightback by actively monitoring the health of the Mole. Dorking volunteers record monthly results which are captured on the Epicollect app and collated by the Trust.

As custodians of our rivers, anglers are providing the evidence (through water samples) that will hold the polluters to account and

strengthen the legislation needed to protect our precious waterways. Fish Legal, the Trust's sister organisation,

is already taking offenders to task in the High Court.

What's more, the Angling Trust is calling on political parties to deliver a clear plan to tackle river pollution in their upcoming general election manifestos.

The 'Anglers Against Pollution' campaign has received positive media coverage across national and regional broadcasting, radio and print, as well as on social media platforms.


With our rivers in sharp decline, there's never been a more important time for the angling community to come together.

A SNAPSHOT OF PROGRESS & RESULTS

- The Trust has had 525 enquiries to join the roll out on WQMN
- 421 monitoring kits have been distributed to volunteers
- The network now covers 201 rivers across 61 catchments
- Of the 4,210 samples taken, 1,556 exceeded the upper limit for Phosphate - 37%
- 1,795 samples were 5ppm (considered toxic) or over for Nitrate - 43%
- 1,047 samples exceeded Phosphate and Nitrate limits 25%
- 55 results exceeded the upper limit for Ammonia
- 177 observed algae blooms and 235 pollution incidents noted

ANGLERS NATIONAL LINE RECYCLING SCHEME



We all respool are reels from time to time, but how much thought do we give to the old, discarded line. Think about the fact a heavy monofilament line that goes to landfill can take up to 600 years to degrade.

It was this staggering statistic that inspired the 'Anglers National Line Recycling Scheme' - the first line recycling project of its kind in the UK. As a non-profit operation, any surplus money generated goes to fund projects that benefit anglers, angling and the environment.

The club has agreed to get behind the ANLRS by installing a pipe bin at Castlefields Lake, purchased thanks to the generous donation of a Dorking member. So let's do our bit to support this great initiative by filling it with unwanted line.
