3,284 Households served

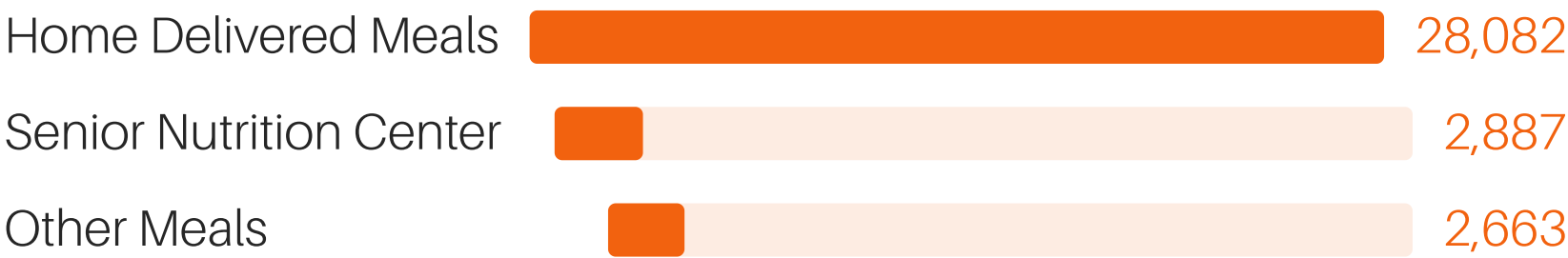
8,352 Food orders fulfilled

Housing aid closes the crisis gap

MHTF Housing Assistance carried a 35,261 project budget, with 6,443 disbursed to households facing eviction. Emergency Assistance added a 37,721 budget, catching crisis moments the food and meal programs alone could not reach.
