The Cost of Neglecting Virtue Formation in Children

In a fast-paced world increasingly influenced by screens, instant gratification, and ever-changing cultural values, it has never been more important to consider the importance of virtue formation in children. Neglecting to instill virtues such as honesty, patience, humility, compassion, and courage, runs the risk of raising a generation well-equipped with information but lacking in character.

Without guidance in virtue, it is highly likely that children will struggle to navigate moral dilemmas, resist peer pressure, or form authentic relationships. The absence of a moral compass will lead to increased anxiety, impulsivity, entitlement, and a diminished sense of responsibility. These outcomes don't just affect individual children — they ripple outward, influencing classrooms, families, communities, and ultimately society at large.

Virtue formation is not about enforcing perfection, but about helping children recognize right from wrong and develop the ability to choose the good, even when it's difficult. Virtue education is rooted in love, modeled through consistent adult example, and nurtured by daily habits and faith. In Catholic education, this task is of the highest priority. We are not only teaching children to read and write, but to love God, to serve others, and to become the people they are called to be.

When we prioritize virtue, we help children grow into wise, resilient, and joyful adults. When we neglect it, we risk leaving them unanchored in a world that desperately needs the light of goodness. We're grateful that you shared your Little One with us as they began their school journey. Much love to you all! - Mrs. Mahoney














Miss Bedard's Pre-K

Music Class with Mrs. Sprague



Older grades have been learning about music and composers of the Romantic and Impressionist period and playing recorders.

Throughout this semester, the bands have been focusing on a variety of musical skills, including articulation patterns, exploring new key signatures, recognizing dynamic changes, interpreting tempo and stylistic markings, and strengthening rhythmic accuracy. Meanwhile, the choir has been deepening their understanding of solfege (do-re-mi, etc.) and its role in sight-reading, and building confidence in singing harmonized parts. Their vocal tone and blend continue to improve as they practice proper vocal techniques, particularly breath support and vowel placement. The SJA Choir has been invited to perform in the Jubilee Concert at St. James Basilica on Sunday, April 13, at 2:00 PM. They will present a unison piece on their own and join the Basilica Choir for a four-part arrangement, singing in the soprano, alto, and tenor sections. All are welcome to attend this special event!
