FORTITUDE

Fortitude, also known as courage, enables one to endure difficulties for the sake of what is good. In 1 Samuel we see David running for his life as King Saul tries to track him down and kill him. After David defeated Goliath and was getting more attention than Saul liked, Saul became jealous of David. While David was on the run, he wrote many songs, including Psalm 8:1-2 which says, "I love you, O Lord, my strength. The Lord is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge. He is my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold."

When we face difficult times, what is our first response? Do we complain and blame others or do we wait on the Lord and praise His name? Think about what it must have been like for David while he was hiding for his life. Would you be able to praise God and and trust in His plan for you?
