Pastor's Letter



Recently, my daughter was home, and we began watching the Netflix series *Wednesday* which is a spin-off of the old TV show *The Adams Family*. In the Netflix show, the odd characters like Wednesday, Thing, and her family are called "the outcasts." The Warren County Public Library is organizing this year's trick-or-treat around the square with an Adam's Family theme. I wasn't sure what to do with that until I heard the words "the outcasts." Then it came to me! *Jesus came for the outcasts!*

When Adam and Eve ate the forbidden fruit, they were *cast out* of the Garden of Eden. Sin had been introduced to the world.

The rest of the Bible is God's relentless pursuit of His people. That separation was never

God's desire! God did not desire His children to be enslaved (as they were in Egypt). So, he sent Moses to free them.

Jesus is often referred to as the new Adam. Jesus is described as the "new" or "last" Adam because his obedience and death brought salvation, justifying life and abundant grace for humanity, in contrast to Adam's sin and disobedience, which brought condemnation and death to all people. The Apostle Paul contrasts these two figures, seeing Jesus as a new head of humanity who reverses the effects of the first Adam's fall, establishing a "new creation" and a "life-giving spirit" for all who believe in him.

C.S. Lewis calls the children in the Narnia series "the sons and daughters of Adam." We are ALL outcastes, and we are ALL Adam's family. And so is every other human on earth! Jesus came for, and Jesus loves the outcasts!

The New Cross—the whole story

Hopefully you have noticed the beautiful new addition to the front of the sanctuary! In March, the Worship team wondered why we couldn't have a cross up front. Knowing Craig Sheagren's talent with wood, I asked Craig to think about what he would envision there. He and Cathy went to a wedding where he was inspired by a cross similar to the design you now see, but he made several prototypes (just in case) and reconvened the decorating committee. They approved this design, and Craig got to work. With wood from Bill and Karen Robinson's grove, and the help of Don Daily and Dave Flaar, this beautiful new cross came to fruition. It needed backlighting, which is where the next beautiful miracle happened. The amount given to the church for Suzanne Lovdahl's memorial was almost the exact amount needed to complete the project. As Jim Lovdahl was a woodworker too, the family was delighted to have Suzanne's gift fund this project. And now, as a focal point for worship, the cross will remain for years to come.

Why the cross? The circle certainly represents the eternity of God. God, and God's love has no beginning and no end. The three circles together represent the trinity: God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Creator, Redeemer, Sustainer. But the cross represents the sacrifice that God made—His leaving heaven to come to earth. The obedience of Jesus, that there is nothing He would not do for us, even death on a cross. He came to free us, He came to save us. And the fact that the cross is empty is a symbol of victory. Jesus is victorious over all sin and all death—yours, mine and EVERYONE else's. In the Protestant tradition, the cross does not represent shame and guilt. It represents faithful love, obedience, and FREEDOM from the sins that haunt us. I encourage you to find this song and listen, but check out these lyrics:

Thank You Jesus for the Blood by Charity Gayle
I was a wretch, I remember who I was
I was lost, I was blind, I was running out of time
Sin separated, the breach was far too wide

But from the far side of the chasm
You held me in Your sight
So You made a way, across the great divide
Left behind, Heaven's throne, to build it here inside
And there at the cross You paid the debt I owe
Broke my chains, freed my soul, for the first time I had hope
Thank You Jesus, for the blood applied
Thank You Jesus, it has washed me white
Thank You Jesus, You have saved my life
Brought me from the darkness into glorious light
You took my place, laid inside my tomb of sin
You were buried for three days but then You walked right out again
And now death has no sting and life has no end
