There are many exciting events coming up that the Worship Committee has planned!

- \*An **ornament sale** will be held in the Atrium on **Sunday, November 9**. The glass ornaments were made by Pat Bates using pieces of stained glass from our previous church. # Grace, Gratitude, and Giving: The Keys to Life

At one of my ordination interviews, I was taken aback by a question about grace, and I said, "Really?! Grace is EVERYTHING!" And it is! But so is gratitude.

In gratitude I find joy, peace, hope, and so many life-giving things!

I made my physical therapist laugh recently when I told her, "I'm grateful for all of the people who fell before me so that my surgeon would know exactly what to do and how to fix my arm." She said she had never thought of it that way.

When each of my parents died, I had a mental list of things for which I was grateful. The top of the list was their faith in God that allows me to have confidence that one day, we will be together again. While I miss them now, I know that our separation is only temporary.

I am also grateful that we loved each other and told each other so. I am grateful for all the ways that they taught me and provided for me over the years. They left me a legacy of faith and a midwestern work ethic. To this day, any time I think of them, I say, "Thank you, God! Thank you for their presence in my life!"

Gratitude gets me through the hard moments.

But gratitude is more than a pleasant feeling. For followers of Christ, gratitude is a way of seeing the world. It shapes how we pray, how we serve, and how we live in community. God's Word reminds us, "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thessalonians 5:18). Gratitude is not a response to having a perfect life—it is a spiritual mindset that opens us to God's presence in every part of life.

When we practice gratitude, we begin to notice grace more often. We recognize blessings even in ordinary moments. It reorients us from an attitude of scarcity to one of abundance—reminding us that everything we have and everything we are comes from God.

Gratitude is life because it awakens joy. It breathes hope into difficult seasons. And when gratitude flows through us, *generosity* naturally follows as well. We find ourselves eager to share, to give, to bless—just as God has blessed us.

In this season, let's challenge ourselves to make gratitude a daily practice. Begin and end each day by naming just one moment of grace—how God gifted us that day. Offer a prayer of thanksgiving. Write a note to thank someone. Speak a kind word. Notice the ways God is moving, even in small details. And as the Apostle Paul wrote, we do not have to be thankful for all things, but *IN* all things, there are always blessings to be found.

May gratitude be the rhythm of our living and the heartbeat of our faith.
