Sermon Series for January 11 – February 1



The Bible begins with a book called Genesis. It is not merely the beginning—it tells the story of "new beginnings." Generation after generation—Adam, Noah, and Abraham—God gave second chances. Here we are at the cusp of a new year, from creation to covenant, what better time to dig into some of the foundational teachings of God's Word to us as we worship together.

Alpha Course begins Tuesday, January 13

Alpha is a course in the fundamentals of Christian faith. The word “alpha” also means “beginning” as it is the first letter of the Greek alphabet. And Jesus calls himself the “Alpha and the Omega” , the first and the last. I have heard many people say that they do not remember much of what they learned in Confirmation class. That’s ok. Confirmation was never meant to be the end of our learning! In the early church, the time leading up to Easter was used to prepare individuals for a commitment to following Christ. I have been teaching the youth version to our High Schoolers this fall, and I wish to offer our adults the same opportunity to firm up their foundations in the basics of what we believe so that we are all equipped to share our faith with more confidence, or simply have a better understanding of what we believe and why. If you wish to join me on this journey, please join me in the Chapel on Tuesday at 6:30 p.m. We will begin on January 13. We will not meet on the first Tuesday of each month due to other church meetings. The final session will be on March 24. Alpha speaks to skeptics, so this is a great opportunity to invite someone.

A New Year, A New Beginning



As we turn the calendar to January, we're reminded once again that our God is a God of new beginnings. The world tells us that a new year is a chance to reset our goals, form new habits, or try again at things we may have set aside. But long before we made New Year's resolutions, God was already in the business of renewal.

Scripture is filled with reminders that God continually leads His people into fresh starts. Part of being a United Methodist pastor is, in addition to responsibilities at the local church, to be part of the broader connection. Most of you know that I serve on the board of the WIU Wesley Foundation, our student ministry in Macomb. You may not know that in addition to that position, I represent WIU Wesley at occasional Board of Higher Education and Campus Ministry (BHECM) meetings which meet several times a year, thankfully on Zoom!

As of this fall, I have now also begun serving on the District Committee on Ordained Ministry (DCOM). This committee oversees people who are exploring and taking steps forward into their call to serve God as a United Methodist pastor. This group meets several times per year. Monmouth will be hosting the March meeting. We provide oversight and accountability for clergy as they make their way through the ordination process. One of my responsibilities to this group is to assign clergy mentors to people in the process. I have always found it to be life-giving to serve on this committee as we get to see pastors who are just beginning their journey in ministry. Their call is fresh, and their experience of God is new, and it is a blessing to be part of the team that encourages them.

And as of December, the District Superintendent has also asked me to be part of a new group that will be working with a consultant to help us to envision how better to meet the needs of our district churches with pastoral leadership that helps those churches to thrive, not just survive. This will require one full day per month of my time. My hope is that the things that I learn there will transfer home to us as well. That because of this time, my ministry in Monmouth will be even better.

We are blessed to be part of a denomination where we are not lone rangers. We are part of something bigger than ourselves. As John Wesley said, and the window in our Chapel quotes, “The World is Our Parish.”
