From the Desk of Bishop John T. Folda:

Our nation has been shaken in recent weeks by shocking acts of violence. Minnesota legislators and their spouses were murdered in their homes. Catholic schoolchildren were shot while attending Mass in Minneapolis. And a young, nationally known political activist was murdered while speaking on a college campus. Of course, other acts of violence occur every day. Sadly, this isn't the first time we have struggled with violence in this country, but these events show the terrible results when we fail to respect the inherent dignity of every human person. When anger and hatred gain the upper hand, violence will inevitably follow. Taking innocent lives to make a point, send a message, or get rid of someone who disagrees with me is sinful and does grave harm to our civilization.

So, what can be done? As always, we must first turn to God. When events seem to spiral out of control, we must ask for God's mercy and protection. In a time of such heartbreaking violence, we ask God to pour out his grace upon us and our nation, to bless us with peace, and to turn all hearts to him. And then, we must reaffirm the existence of good and evil. In a time when so many question the reality of truth and morality, these events make it very clear that some acts, including taking innocent lives, are wrong, always and everywhere. Period. May God bring healing to our nation.
