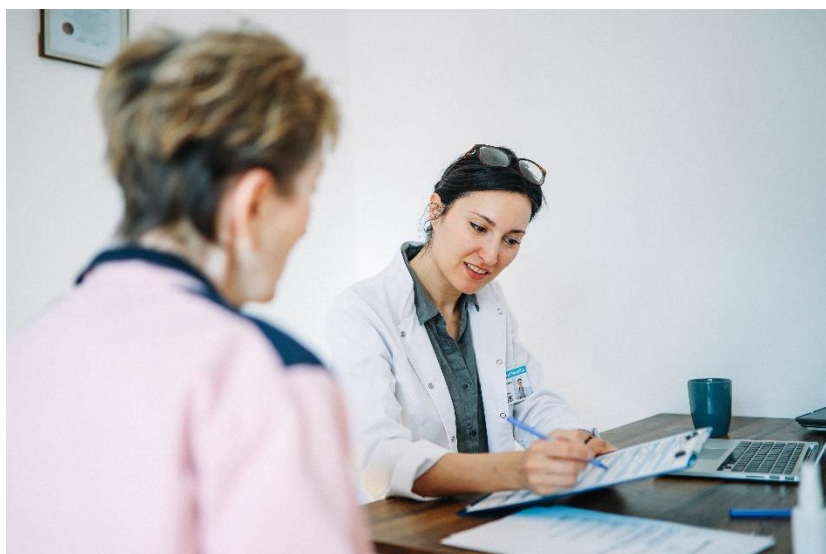


SAFE USE of STIMULANTS in PRIMARY CARE
