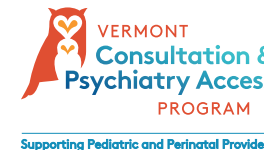

NOTES	* Pediatric = ages 0 - 21
	* Perinatal = pregnant, postpartum, & breast/chest-feeding and individuals in need of preconception consultation.
	* Anyone who is eligible to call is eligible for both a psychiatry consultation (although those tend to be prescriber-to-prescriber) and resource/referral support from the LC team.
	* Special consideration may be given in cases where there is overlap between populations (for example, a pregnant 15-year-old). In such instances, the team will determine the most appropriate provider to respond based on the patient's presenting needs and which clinician is best positioned to offer consultation support.



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
