chopticks. Originating from OBAMA CITY, FUKUI PREFECTURE. These chopsticks are crafted using a unique technique that embeds abalone shells and eggshells into the lacquer.

Hands on experience polishing the chopsticks around the abalone shells.

1:00-2:00p.m. Lunch on our own at MICHI no EKI KUMAGAWA JUKU WAKASA. This place is famous for

Grilled Saba Sushi, Wakasa Beef Bowl, Ume Wakame Ramen, Curry Rice, Katsudon, Udon, &

Soba, & etc.



After, continue on to MIKATA FIVE LAKES, a famous sightseeing spot in Wakasa Bay Quasi-National Park in Fukui Prefecture. We will go up using the lift or cable car to

RAINBOW LINE SUMMIT PARK.

AWARA ONSEN (Fukui)

Buffet breakfast at the hotel.

8:30a.m.

Today enjoy a tour of AWARA ONSEN area.

9:45-11:45a.m.

FUKUI PREFECTURAL DINOSAUR MUSEUM is one of the leading dinosaur museums in the world. It is the biggest in Japan and the museum is filled of various dinosaur skeletons, fossils of other animals, plants, diorama with dinosaur life reconstruction models, and so forth. Visitors can have a close look at spectacular dinosaur animatronics (robots) showing powerful and realistic motions.

1:00-2:45p.m.

TOJINBO is the most famous tourist attraction in Fukui Prefecture and considered one of the three most scenic places in the world because of its unique geographical features and dynamic scenery.

It has been designated a national natural monument and a place of scenic beauty.

About 300 meters before the cliffs of Tojinbo, there's a shopping street full of souvenir shops and restaurants offering a variety of fresh seafood, giving visitors a lot of options for lunch. Seafood delicacies from the Sea of Japan, including seafood rice bowls, grilled squid, and turban shells, all of which are simply exquisite! You can also get many different sweets here such as soft-serve ice cream and "cliff-side cream puffs" made to look like the rugged rock formations of Tojinbo.

Last stop, AWARA YU no MACHI HIROBA, you can enjoy a free footbath at "Ashiyu", which the bath is made entirely of Japanese cypress.

THURSDAY, June 4th AWARA ONSEN – KANAZAWA

Buffet breakfast at the hotel. Check-out of the hotel.

9:30a.m. 10:15-11:15a.m. Depart AWARA ONSEN to KANAZAWA with couple sightseeing stops along the way.

First stop, KUBOTA SAKE BREWERY with sake tasting. Not to be msitaken with Niigata's Kubota. Kubota in Fukui is a rare brewery that grows their own "Yamada Nishiki Sake Rice" and brew sake from local water pumped up from 200 meters below ground from the subsoil flows from the Hakusan Mountains. Since the 1960's, Kubota have been using their own in house developed "Koji Rice" making

machine, a truly one of the kind invention used in their sake brewing process.

12:00-1:00p.m.

For lunch, we will have Special ONI OMURICE at MICHI no EKI RENNYO no SATO AWARA.

Arrive at HOTEL NIKKO KANAZAWA for 3 nights stay, the hotel ia about 6 minutes away from JR KANAZAWA STATION.

After check-in, we will guide you to the train station to show you around where the three malls are located ANTO, ANTO NISHI, & RINTO SHOPPING MALL (open from 8:30am – 8:00pm).

On the 2nd floor of ANTO NISHI, there's a drug store and supermarket "100 BAN MART"

(open from 9am -8:30pm).

The rest of the day is at your leisure. (B, L)

FRIDAY, June 5th **KANAZAWA**

7:00a.m.(starts) 9:00a.m.

Buffet breakfast at the hotel.

Bus departs for one day KANAZAWA CITY TOUR.

9:15-11:00a.m.

KENROKUEN GARDEN is considered one of Japan's three most beautiful gardens, It is the most popular tourist site in Kanazawa. From mid to late November, the autumn leaves of Kenrokuen are at their best.

11:15-12:45p.m.

OMICHO MARKET, a must visit place in Kanazawa, it is a spacious indoor complex with stalls selling fresh produce, seafood & meat, plus local specialty dishes. Some free time for lunch at your own expense. If you don't like to eat seafood, Nadine can take you to KANAZAWA M'ZA DEPARTMENT STORE, on B1 Floor, there's a couple of restaurants.

1:15-3:00p.m.

Last stop, HAKUICHI, Kanazawa's Golf Leaf "Kinpaku" Store. We will tour the store to see Gold Samurai Armor display, hands on experience to make "Post Card" using Gold Leaf, and if you want they have delicious Gold Leaf Soft Ice Cream.









3:30p.m.

Return back to hotel, HOTEL NIKKO KANAZAWA. The rest of the day at your leisure. (B)

SATURDAY, June 6th KANAZAWA - WAJIMA - KANAZAWA

7:00a.m.(starts)

Buffet breakfast at the hotel.

8:00a.m.

Bus departs for one day of NOTO-WAJIMA area.

10:15-11:15a.m.

First stop in WAJIMA is the POWER CITY WAI PLAZA, a shopping mall that currently hosts the famed WAJIMA MORNING MARKET. Originally located near the waterfront, the morning market is one of the icons and attractions of Wajima featuring over 150 shops selling local goods and produce. However, all of that was destroyed by the earthquake and ensuing fire in 2024, and the market now has a temporary home at the Wai Plaza with approximately 30 shops.







11:45-2:00p.m.

SHIROYONE SENMAIDA (means 1004 rice fields) a scenic hillside of tiered rice paddies, situated along the Noto Peninsula.

These unusual fields were nationally designated a "Special Place of Scenic Beauty"

Lunch on your own next door at MICHI no EKI SHIROYONE SENMAIDA POCKET PARK.

3:45-4:30p.m.

Last stop before going back to Kanazawa is CHIRIHAMA NAGISA DRIVEWAY, also known as Chirihama Beach Drive, It is a unique attraction at the western base of Noto Peninsula, almost 5 miles Stretch of beach along the Sea of Japan that is open to private vehicles, allowing people to take a short ride along the water's edge.

5:30p.m.

Arrive back to HOTEL NIKKO KANAZAWA. The rest of the day at your leisure. (B)

SUNDAY, June 7th KANAZAWA – TAKAYAMA

7:00a.m.(starts) 9:00a.m.

Breakfast at the hotel. Check-out of the hotel. Bus departs for TAKAYAMA via TOYAMA.

10:30-11:30a.m.

A stop at AINOKURA VILLAGE, a historical landscape of GOKAYAMA and its original 20 well preserved Gasho-zukuri (thatched roof houses). People still live in this village, which is rare among World Heritage Sites.

After lunch, walk over to GASSHO MUSEUM, get to know everything there is to know about Gassho-Zukuri. A relocated genuine replica of the "Gassho-zukuri" styled building and understand more of the construction process by seeing this exhibition.

3:30p.m.

Check-in at TAKAYAMA GREEN HOTEL (Orinkaku Building) for 2 nights stay, western style onsen

hotel located in the heart of Hida Takayama and 10 minutes walk to JR Takayama Station. Coin laundry facility on the hotel property. Enjoy making your own rice crackers "SENBEI" under the

guidance of their expert attendant. 5 Senbei for 550Yen(Set).

6:00-7:30p.m.

Japanese, Western, Chinese combination buffet dinner at the hotel.

MONDAY, June 8h **TAKAYAMA**

7:00a.m.(starts)

Breakfast at the hotel.

9:00a.m.

A day tour of TAKAYAMA.

9:15-10:15a.m. First stop, MIYAGAWA MORNING MARKET, along the Miyagawa River. Open stalls selling local

crafts, snacks and farm products such as vegetables, pickles and flowers.

HIDA TAKAYAMA MATSURI no MORI located outside of Takayama City. 10:30a.m.-12:00p.m.

> The main exhibition space has a number of magnificent, life-sized replica floats are displayed, offering visitors a close view at their elaborate designs, decorations and karakuri dolls. Karakuri dolls are marionettes which are a key feature in the Takayama Festival. Also have displays of several huge taiko

drums, said to be the biggest drums in the world.

Lunch on our own along the way.

Walk around SANNOMACHI STREET, the most retro spot in Takayama. This area is also known as 3:00p.m.-4:30p.m.

"Little Kyoto" because of the preservation of the town construction from the Edo period.

Along the way is a stop at one of the FUNASAKA SAKE BREWERY. For sample tasting included in your tour fee.

Free shopping and lunch time at AEON MALL SEKI.

2:30p.m. Last stop, NAGARA RIVER UKAI MUSEUM, a museum with information about "UKAI"

cormorant fishing on the Nagara River" which is the major tradition and culture to represent Gifu City.

Arrive at MIYAKO HOTEL GIFU NAGARAGAWA for 1 night stay.

Buffet dinner at the hotel. 5:30-6:45p.m.

7:00-8:45p.m.

After dinner, shuttle bus to the boat pier, this evening, you will be seeing the famous" UKAI" viewing from the boat. Cormorant fishing has about 1,300 years of history and has traditionally been protected by both local and national authorities. It is said that the Sengoku ("Warring States Period") general Oda Nobunaga took the Ukai fishermen under his official patronage and created the official position of usho (Cormorant Fishing Master). The cormorants are tethered by rings around the neck so that they don't swallow the fish and the birds are released in to the river in search of Japanese trout from long, covered wooden fishing boats with braziers out front to attract the fish.

Return back to MIYAKO HOTEL GIFU NAGARAGAWA. (B, D) 9:00p.m.

WEDNESDAY, June 10th GIFU - NAGOYA - HONOLULU

7:00(starts)

Buffet breakfast at the hotel.

8:45a.m. Check-out of the hotel.

9:00a.m. Bus departs for NAGOYA CHUBU CENTRAIR AIRPORT with couple stops along the way. 10:00a.m.-12:30p.m. First stop, famous NAGOYA CASTLE. In 1610, Tokugawa Ieyasu began the construction of Nagoya Castle, as a residence for his son Yoshinao. Completed in 1615, the Hommaru Palace served as the official residence and administrative offices of the Owari Tokugawa clan. Along with the tower keeps, the Hommaru Palace was among the first castle structures to be designated a National Treasure, however, it

was destroyed in the wartime air raids of 1945. Using existing Edo period (1603-1868) architectural plans and other historical resources, the palace was authentically rebuilt in 2018, returning it to its former glory. Lunch at your own expense at Nagoya Castle's Kinshachi Yokocho (Street), restaurants close to the main gate represent traditional Nagoya local specialities such as Hitsumabushi (char-grilled ungai fillets on a bed of steamed rice). Miso Nikomi Udon (flat Kishimen flat noodle with Hatcho miso soup), and Miso Katsu (deep fried tonkatsu coated with miso sauce).

1:30-2:45p.m. SCMAGLEV (Superconducting Magnetically Levitated Vehicle) and RAILWAY MUSEUM of

Central Japan Railways (JR Central). The museum seeks to educate visitors on the advances in high speed rail in Japan and displays a number of actual trains, including historic steam locomotives, world record setting experimental shinkansen (bullet train) and the latest magnetic levitating trains (maglev).

Many of them can be enter or view.

4:00-5:30p.m. Last stop, AEON MALL TOKONAME for last minute shopping.

The largest Maneki Neko (Lucky Cat) in the world is displayed inside Aeon Mall at the Tokoname Restaurant Street.
