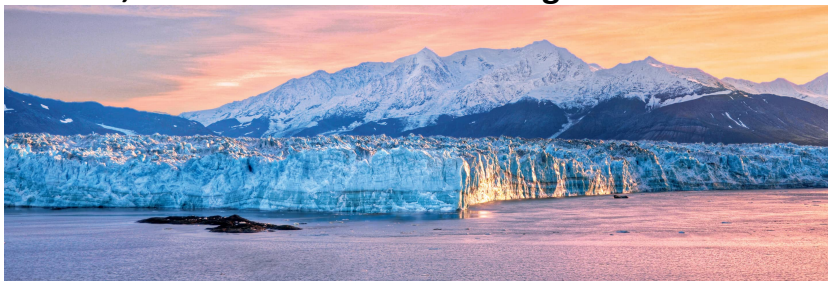

A city moose roaming the streets (there are about 1,500) is a regular sight and views of whales, puffins, otters, and Dall porpoises going about their days. Cruises to Anchorage are a must for those that want some of the most incredible bear viewing in the country.

JULY 18, SUNDAY Anchorage – Whittier by Rail

Enjoy a scenic rail journey along picturesque Turnagain Arm aboard the cruise train before embarking your ship. Holland America Line's Alaska Cruise Tours now include the tiny town of Whittier. This remote village is nestled along the breathtaking Prince William Sound, home to a stunning array of wildlife, including bald eagles, sea otters and killer whales, so have your camera ready. Whittier has the odd distinction of being almost entirely under one roof. No need to get in a car to go to the grocery store, bank or a friend's house. All town services are sheltered from the often-inclement weather in this unique and practical way, and virtually all of Whittier's approximately 220 residents live in the 14-story Begich Towers, originally a Cold War outpost for the U.S. Army. JULY 19, MONDAY Cruising the Hubbard Glacier



Enjoy a leisurely day highlighted by afternoon scenic cruising to Hubbard Glacier - North America's longest tidewater glacier.

An Alaska cruise toward Hubbard Glacier feels like you're approaching another planet in a tiny space craft. Among all the vanishing Alaska glaciers, Hubbard has a rapidly advancing ice margin— up to seven feet in one day—earning it the nickname, "the Galloping Glacier."

Hubbard Glacier cruises are so popular because of the glacier's three-story icebergs that cannon into crystal waters, a process called calving. It's also colorful. On clear days, Hubbard turns a stunning deep blue and on cloudy ones, its many ripples and icebergs shimmer in soft light.

This glacier dwarfs the other glaciers in Alaska. It is the longest tidewater glacier in North America and starts 122 kilometers (76 miles) back, pouring down off the shoulder of Mt. Walsh. It has an impressive terminal face that is 11 kilometers (7 miles) long and 106 meters (350 feet) above the water line, making its regular audience of Alaska cruise ships look like toy boats.

It's a giant, but it's not sleeping. Hubbard Glacier is one of the few Alaska glaciers that's advancing and not succumbing to climate change. It sounds uplifting, but many fear that the expanding glacier will block the entrance to the fjord.

JULY 20, TUESDAY

Cruising the Glacier Bay



Cruise the ice-studded fjords of this national treasure for a full eight hours as a Park Service Ranger narrates. On your cruise to Glacier Bay, close your eyes and take in the sounds—the creaks and groans of “living” ice, the shrill cries of gulls and soaring eagles, the splash of a breaching humpback whale. Frosted peaks towering over mossy forests, wide tidewater glaciers (there are seven in the park), and marine wildlife are givens on Glacier Bay cruises, but every experience in this changing biosphere is unique.

White Pass Summit Scenic Railroad (starting from \$170.00)

Nadine recommends this White Pass Summit Scenic Railroad

Take an unforgettable round-trip journey aboard the **White Pass & Yukon Route Railroad**. Against all odds, this iron trail was built through some of the North's most ruggedly beautiful terrain and, more than 120 years later, is still in operation. Ride in a comfortable, restored or replica vintage rail car to the **summit of the White Pass**,

through two tunnels, over sky-high trestles, and remote valleys. Pass Bridal Veil Falls, Inspiration Point and Dead Horse Gulch as your guide announces all points of interest and tells the story of the Klondike Gold Rush. At the White Pass Summit at 2,865 feet, the train makes a loop and heads back down the pass, allowing everyone to experience excellent views during this round-trip rail journey. This narrow-gauge railroad is an **International Historic Civil Engineering Landmark**. It shares this honor with the Panama Canal, the Eiffel Tower and the Statue of Liberty and is truly a world wonder.

JULY 22, THURSDAY Juneau

Enjoy a full day of exploring Alaska's capital-choose from exciting shore excursions and still have time to shop. Cruise to Juneau, Alaska and visit the most remote, most beautiful and strangest state capital in the United States. Mendenhall Glacier, Hatchery, & Salmon Bake (starting at \$145.00)

Travel through Juneau's picturesque downtown to the mighty **Mendenhall Glacier**, a moving river of ice with rugged crevasses. Visit the **Macaulay Salmon Hatchery** and learn about the importance of Alaska's salmon and the impact these clever fish have on the environment and economy of the 49th state. Enjoy excellent eagle viewing and the variety of local marine life in aquariums. Then you'll board a motorcoach and head to the traditional Alaskan salmon bake at Salmon Creek. An Alaskan feast, this salmon bake features Alaskan-caught wild salmon grilled over an open alderwood fire. Also enjoy barbecue ribs, cheesy au gratin potatoes, baked beans with reindeer sausage, wild-rice pilaf, fresh salads, cornbread and lemonade, coffee or tea. Beverages are available for purchase. Dine beside Salmon Creek in Southeast Alaska's rain forest and listen to a local musician. A translucent roof protects you, rain or shine. After dining, toast marshmallows over a crackling campfire and walk to view the beautiful Salmon Creek waterfall. Remnants of the historic Wagner Mine are evident here. Return to the ship by shuttle bus.

JULY 23, FRIDAY Ketchikan

Ketchikan is home to this dynamic experience that combines culture, history and cuisine. It takes place in scenic downtown Ketchikan's historic Thomas Basin district, where crab boats and the fishing fleet are moored. At the Village Carving Center, skilled craftsmen pass on their skill to eager apprentices.

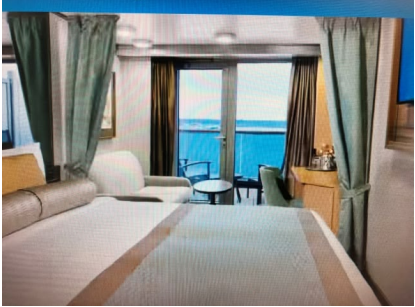
